2021 Supervisorial Redistricting Project Update

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November 8, 2021

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What is Redistricting?

- Redistricting is the process by which Supervisorial District boundaries are drawn every 10 years to ensure each district has the same number of people.
- The boundaries of the supervisorial districts shall be adopted by the Board no earlier than August 1, 2021. The final map must be adopted 174 days before the June 7, 2022, Statewide Direct Primary Election, which is December 15, 2021.



What are the Mapping Criteria?

Criteria Ranked in Order of Priority ("to the extent practicable")

- 1. Compliance with US and CA Constitution (equal population)
- 2. Compliance with Federal Voting Rights Act (race and language minorities)
- 3. Contiguity
- 4. Respect for* local neighborhoods and Communities of Interest (COIs)
 - COIs may not include relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.
- 5. Respect for* Cities and Census Designated Places
- 6. Boundaries should be easily identifiable and understandable by residents
- 7. Compactness: If it doesn't conflict with preceding criteria
- 8. Do not favor or discriminate against political parties


* "Respect for" means minimize divisions

Criteria Under AB 849

- 1. To the extent practicable, districts must be geographically contiguous.
- 2. To the extent practicable, districts must maintain the geographic integrity of neighborhoods and communities of interest.
- 3. To the extent practicable, districts must minimize division of cities or census designated places.
- 4. Boundaries must be easily identifiable and, if possible, bound by natural/artificial barriers.
- 5. To the extent practicable, districts must not favor or discriminate against any political party.

Map-Drawing Process

- 1. Data was received via the California Statewide Database*
- 2. County's Information Technology Central (ITC) Department analyzed the data
- 3. County's Project Team received 29 submissions (24 in Spanish) on Communities of Interest
- 4. ITC provided data and maps, along with Communities of Interest submissions, which were shared with the Ad Hoc Citizen Advisory Redistricting Commission (Commission)
- 5. Project Team assisted Commission in reviewing data and mapping Communities of Interest submissions
- 6. On October 28, 2021 the Commission voted initially to recommend Draft Supervisorial Map Alternative 1 (discussions about this draft map are ongoing)




Review and Decision Steps:


- 1. 4 Census Blocks* that spanned districts were identified by ITC

- 3. On October 28, 2021 the Commission voted to recommend Draft Supervisorial Map Alternative 1 (discussions about this draft map are ongoing)














District 5 - Alternative Map 1

Redistricting Website

- State law requires the Board to establish and maintain a website dedicated to redistricting for at least 10 years following adoption of the new supervisorial district boundaries (Elections Code Section 21508(g)).
- The Project Team created a website located at <u>http://www.stancounty.com/redistricting</u>.
- The website contains information on mapping and a mapping tool, communities of interest, workshops and hearings, proposed maps, glossary and data source links, and frequently asked questions (FAQ).
