CC Update Newsletter & Discussion	Curtis Rager	Genesis, which provides narcotic replacement therapy was first licensed in January of 1983. Genesis is a medical model; (methadone maintenance and detoxification) which focuses on harm reduction. According to the New York Times, Prescription drug abuse is America's fast-growing drug problem. One of the ways Genesis is responding to the opioid crisis is to provide Naoloxone (Narcan) an antidote to opioid induced overdoses to clients. Genesis provides a place of acceptance, support and hope, staffed by individuals qualified to deliver highly technical forms of intervention while coordinating with other community providers.
