DISCUSSION:

The need to expand the Honor Farm's sewer pond capacity has been previously identified. In response to this identified need, work has been underway to design and secure the required outside agency approvals for the two additional sewer treatment ponds.

The next step in this process is the approval of and posting of a Mitigated Negative Declaration. Following this action by the Board, the Regional Water Quality Control Board will take action to approve the County's project to construct two additional sewer treatment ponds adjoining the existing treatment facility at the Stanislaus County Honor Farm. The two additional treatment ponds will cover an area of approximately one-half acre.

POLICY

ISSUE:

This action, which will lead to the expansion of the Honor Farm's sewer treatment capacity, meets the Board's goal of providing a safe and healthy community.

MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION

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located on the northwest boundary of the site.

Based upon the Initial Study, dated <u>July 19, 1999</u>, the Environmental Coordinator finds as follows:

- 1. This project does not have the potential to degrade the quality of the environment, nor to curtail the diversity of the environment.
- 2. This project will not have a detrimental effect upon either short-term or long-term environmental goals.
- 3. This project will not have impacts which are individually limited but cumulatively considerable.
- 4. This project will not have environmental impacts which will cause substantial adverse effects upon human beings, either directly or indirectly.

The aforementioned findings are contingent upon the following mitigation measures (if indicated) which shall be incorporated into this project:

- 1. Prior to operation of the expanded facility, all appropriate permits shall be obtained through the Regional Water Quality Control Board and other appropriate regulatory agencies.
- 2. All work in progress shall be immediately halted if archaeological resources are discovered on site until clearance is obtained from the Planning and Community Development Director to proceed. The County shall be responsible for any costs associated with retaining a qualified archaeologist and completion of a work plan which identifies methods to avoid

significant impacts should any resources be discovered during excavation.

3. The facility should be maintained and closely monitored to avoid impacting any neighboring sensitive air quality receptors. The project shall comply with San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District Regulation VIII (Fugitive Dust Prohibitions.)
