### DISCUSSION:

# Workforce Investment Board (WIB) Youth Advisory Council (YAC) Membership

The Workforce Investment Act (WIA) requires that the chief local elected official appoint members to the WIB and YAC. On January 20, 2001, the WIB approved and recommended appointment of two new members. They are:

- Enid Alvarez, currently a student high school in Modesto. Enid is also a participant in Modesto City School's BEST program, funded by the YAC and WIB. Presently there are no term limits for Youth Advisory Council appointments.
- Sonja Pittman, representing parents of eligible Youth. This
  representation is required under the Workforce Investment Act.

# POLICY ISSUES:

This initiative meets the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors' goals and priorities in the following ways:

### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

The WIB has positive, long-term effects on economic development in Stanislaus County by promoting private sector involvement in economic development efforts, coordinating resources, and overseeing the "Future Factory" one-stop workforce development system, providing customers the means to achieve self-sufficiency through placement in unsubsidized employment. This program uses federal funds that positively impact the local economy.

### **COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP**

The Stanislaus County WIB provides the vision for collaboration of Education, Employment & Training, Community Service, and Economic Development Programs, reinforced by active Business Community involvement, with the objective of positively influencing future workforce and community development.

The Department of Employment and Training (DET) anticipates no impact on staffing as a result of this action.
