- **DISCUSSION:** Upon Board of Supervisor's approval, the Health Services Agency wishes to submit a Standard Agreement to the California Department of Health Services for Public Health Preparedness and Response to Bioterrorism Grant funding.

It is our objective to broaden the scope of bioterrorism preparedness training within our county. This would include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Public Health Nurses
- County Clinic Staff Members
- American Red Cross Volunteers
- EMS Personnel
- Hospital Emergency Personnel
- Physicians within the Community

More importantly, we feel strongly that the training has to be continuous; that is, a core training that can be provided to new personnel as they become active at various areas and levels within our county. We need training videotapes, as well as short tests to determine completion of training. Further, we need funds to have drills to ascertain that the multiple disciplines can work together.

POLICY

S: Approval to respond to the Standard agreement will allow the Agency to improve and expand the Public Health's Infrastructure of Bioterrorism preparedness training within our county.

Focus Area E: Health Alert Network Public Health Preparedness and Response to Bioterrorism Grant Local Health Department Preparedness Allocations Federal Fiscal Year 2000-2001

STANISLAUS COUNTY

Name of the Local Health Department

The State of California, by and through the Department of Health Services (hereinafter called the "Department"), and the Local Health Department (hereinafter called "LHD"), do hereby agree as follows:

This agreement is entered into pursuant to the provisions set forth in the Focus Area E: Health Alert Network, Public Health Preparedness and Response to Bioterrorism, Strategic Plan.

As a condition of receiving \$10,000 of Public Health Preparedness and Response to Bioterrorism Grant funds, the LHD agrees to all the following provisions:

I. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED EXPENDITURES REQUIREMENTS

- A. Complete a Description of Proposed Expenditures form specifying how the LHD intends to enhance local preparedness for responding to terrorist threats.
- B. Comply with health alert network activities, performance monitoring, and accountability requirements as specified in this Standard Agreement and the attached addendum, the Description of Proposed Expenditures form.

II. EXPENDITURE/PROJECT REQUIREMENTS

- A. Expend the funds for strengthening the capacity of the LHD to enhance local preparedness for responding to terrorist threats. LHDs can utilize these funds for any or all of the following purposes:
 - 1. Achieving activities/capacities recommended in the bioterrorism module of National Public Health Performance Standards Program.
 - 2. Attaining Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Architectural Standards and Performance Characteristics for Personal Computer Technology.
 - 3. Implementing activities specified in the Office of Emergency Services Local Planning Guidance on Terrorism Response.

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- 4. Coordinating and enhancing terrorism preparedness and response procedures with Metropolitan Medical Response Systems (if present) and the California National Guard Rapid Assessment Initial Detection team.
- 5. Developing local applications of information technology and the Internet to terrorism response capacity, especially in areas of communication between responders, and providing information to local government officials, the media, health providers and institutions, and the general public.
- 6. Providing local training and skill building to supplement the Department's training for local alert participants.
 - 7. Formalizing cooperative terrorism response agreements at the local level, including those with surrounding counties not receiving direct Year 2 funding in this Focus Area.

III. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- A. Submit two quarterly and one annual progress reports documenting activities and the expenditure of funds as specified by the Department.
- B. Maintain financial records of the expenditures for at least three years after the end of the Federal Fiscal Year. During this time, these financial records will be subject to possible review and audit by the State of California and the Federal Government.

MINIMAL TRAINING ACTIVITY. The best-trained individuals within the county are within our public safety sector. The Battalion Chief for the City of Modesto Fire Department has had extensive training because the Department of Defense grant was designated for Modesto rather than Stanislaus County. Within our Health Department we have had two individuals, our communicable nurse and our epidemiologist, who have attended half-day sessions sporadically during the past two years. Otherwise there has been no systematic training. We have the 12-hour tape prepared by the Centers for Disease Control in 1998; however, these are partially outdated.

Explain how it (the training program) will be improved

It is our objective to BROADEN THE SCOPE OF BIO-TERRORISM PREPAREDNESS TRAINING within our county. This would include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Public Health nurses
- County clinic staffmembers
- American Red Cross volunteers
- EMS personnel
- Hospital emergency personnel
- Physicians within the community

More important, we feel strongly that the training has to be continuous; that is, a core training that can be provided to new personnel as they become active at various areas and levels within our county. We need training videotapes, as well as short test to determine completion of training. Further, we need funds to have drills so as to ascertain that the multiple disciplines can work together.

COMMENT: We have training needs within each of the seven "Purpose" categories, ag, including information technologies. We have selected "f" because it is our highest need. Our second highest need is to provide training to adjacent counties, such as Merced and Tuolumne because they are part of our disaster response contingency model.
