STAFF RECOM- MENDATION CONTINUED:	3. DIRECT THE AUDITOR-CONTROLLER TO ACCEPT REPAYMENT AND TO ALLOCATE \$400,000 FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY SECURED BY THE PROMISSORY NOTE DESCRIBED IN RECOMMENDATION NO. 2.		
DISCUSSION:	In February 2000, the Stanislaus County Redevelopment Agency borro \$400,000 from the Stanislaus County General Fund. Interest has a calculated on funds used at the rate based on the current interest realized by the Lender on investments as determined quarterly by the Cou Treasurer-Tax Collector. Therefore, principal and interest owed as of M 13, 2001 is \$425,264.98. Accrued interest will increase based upon actual date of repayment. This note may be prepaid by the Agency with penalty.		
	During Fiscal Year 2000/2001, the Redevelopment Agency received its allocation of tax increment generated in the Project Area. This allocation is based on Agency debt. To continue receiving tax increment in subsequent years, the Agency must be able to demonstrate debt. It is important to use tax increment funds for debt service and not for current operational expenses. Accordingly, the Agency desires to repay existing debt owed Stanislaus County and request a new loan for purposes of implementing work plan activities.		
POLICY ISSUES:	It is the policy of the Agency to assist Stanislaus County facilitate the increase and conservation of affordable housing, the retrofit and rehabilitation of public infrastructure, and the promotion of economic development. These goals are part of the Stanislaus County General Plan Housing and Land Use Elements, as well as the Redevelopment Plan of the Agency. Redevelopment is used as a financial tool to assist in the implementation of these goals.

# STAFF RECOM-MENDATION

- CONTINUED: 4. AMEND THE SALARY AND POSITION ALLOCATION RESOLUTION AS STATED IN STAFFING IMPACTS EFFECTIVE THE START OF THE SECOND PAY PERIOD ON <u>MARCH 24, 2001</u>.
- **DISCUSSION:** The Redevelopment Agency has expended 44 percent of budget at mid year. Revenues have been received at 2 percent, however, it is expected that all estimated revenues will be received by the end of the fiscal year. The Agency's largest revenue is derived from property taxes, currently budgeted at \$1,185,000. This revenue is not yet reflected in the Agency's operating report, however, it is expected to be posted by year-end.

Staff is currently involved in the process of securing interim financing relative to a Rural Development loan to construct storm drainage infrastructure in Salida. This interim financing may be in terms of loan or bond funds and will be retired by Rural Development loan funds once the project has been completely constructed.

Efforts continue regarding property tax increment allocation methodology with the State Controller's office. The Agency's legal counsel, County Counsel, Auditor-Controller and staff maintain that the methodology used is consistent with the State Constitution and <u>Agency v. County of San Bernardino</u> (1978). Attempts are being made with the County Legislative lobbyist to introduce legislation that recognizes the methodology used by Stanislaus County as appropriate and correct.

At this time, a request is made for an Assistant/Associate Planner position to assist with the State/Federal grants and redevelopment projects, at an approximate cost to the Redevelopment Agency of \$31,600 for the remainder of this fiscal year (including \$2,500) in one time computer expenses) and \$63,200 per year thereafter. The Executive Director is also requesting a reclassification study of one Senior Planner (Manager III) position to Deputy Executive Director (Manager IV).

<u>Recommendations:</u> It is recommended that the Agency add one Assistant/Associate Planner position to assist with grants and redevelopment projects, at an approximate cost of \$31,600 for the remainder of this fiscal year (including \$2,500 in one time computer expenses) and \$63,200 per year thereafter, recoverable through grant funds. It is also recommended that the Senior Planner, Manager III, position be studied for possible reclassification.

These recommendations were received, reviewed and approved by the Board of Supervisors at their March 13, 2001 meeting.

SUBJECT: COMMITMENT OF \$1 MILLION TO THE 2001 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT APPLICATION - SHACKELFORD SEWER

**DISCUSSION:** Stanislaus County proposes to submit a \$500,000 Community Block Grant (CDBG) application to the State Housing and Community Development Department for funds to assist in the construction of a sewer collection and transfer system in a portion of the Shackelford subarea. The estimated cost of this project is \$2 million. The Department of Public Works has indicated that \$500,000 of road funds will be committed to this project should the CDBG grant be awarded. Grant applications earn points in areas such as program design, elimination of health and safety problems, level of service to target income group and local funding match. It is in the area of local funding match that this request is being made.

The thrust of the use of Redevelopment is to eliminate blight from within its Project Area. The elimination of individual septic tanks that can have negative effects upon the health and safety of a neighborhood does eliminate blight.

This project would be serviced by the Modesto Sewer Service facilities. City staff has encouraged, via letter, the submittal of the grant application and indicates that there is adequate capacity in the existing trunk that would serve this area. However, if awarded the grant, County would prepare for execution, an agreement between County and City that stipulates the provision of sewer service.

The commitment of \$1 million will serve as a portion of Stanislaus County's local match in the 2001 CDBG application for \$500,000.

# POLICY ISSUES:

The Redevelopment Plan is a tool to implement the goals and policies of Stanislaus County. It identifies infrastructure as an eligible Project Area activity. It also encourages the leveraging of Agency funds with other resources to facilitate additional activity. This project was identified during the planning stages for redevelopment by the representatives of Shackelford on the Project Area Committee as their first priority. Further, the Housing Element of the Stanislaus County General Plan encourages application for CDBG funding to assist the County in conserving its affordable housing stock.

#### STAFFING IMPACT:

Present staff would implement this authorization and the subject grant should it be funded.

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
