DISCUSSION:

The Governor and the California Legislature have proclaimed April as Child Abuse Prevention Awareness Month, calling attention to the special role that the Community Services Agency and its community partners play in child abuse prevention.

The statistics of children who are abused and neglected escalate each year. In 1999, more than 3.2 million children were reported to child protective agencies in the United States as having suffered abuse and neglect. It is estimated that at least six dollars are saved for every three dollars spent on child abuse and neglect prevention. These saved dollars could be spent on child welfare services, special education services, medical care, and counseling to further reduce child abuse. Child abuse is a community problem and finding solutions depends on involvement by whole communities.

Effective child abuse prevention programs succeed because of partnerships created among families, community agencies, schools, religious organizations, law enforcement agencies and the business community. Prevention programs offer positive alternatives for young people and encourage youth to develop strong ties to their communities. All residents of Stanislaus County should become more aware of child abuse and its prevention and become involved in supporting parents to raise their children in a safe, nurturing environment. The Agency desires to bring to the attention of all citizens the importance of child abuse prevention that includes services provided in collaboration with the Departments of Probation, Health Services Agency, Behavioral Health and Recovery Services and our many community partners.

The blue ribbon is the national symbol of Child Abuse Prevention Awareness. We encourage all citizens to wear or display blue ribbons during the month of April to promote awareness of Child Abuse and Neglect throughout the community.

In 1998, CWLA and Alameda County launched a national public campaign to heighten awareness of increasing violence against children by developing the Children's Memorial Flag and asking State Governments and CWLA members to fly the flag on the fourth Friday of April. This past April, on the fourth Friday of the month, 35 governors, 35 mayors and numerous organizations across the country participated by flying the Children's Memorial Flag. Locally, the flag was flown by the Community Services Agency, the Department of Mental Health and the District Attorney's Office as a way of acknowledging needless child deaths and committing to do more to protect children

The Community Services Agency is recommending that April 27, 2001 be proclaimed Children's Memorial Day and that the Community Services Agency and other interested departments be authorized to fly the commemorative flag.
