File No. 1010-08 L DISCUSSION: In recognition of Victims' Rights Week, April 22nd through April 28th, the District Attorney's Office Victim Services Program is planning a ceremony to dedicate completion of the second phase of the Victims' Garden of Healing. Completion of the first phase last year included the removal of the lawn and creation of a walkway and patio area. Completion of the second phase consists of the planting of over thirty five (35) rose bushes with other assorted plants and flowers and the addition of benches to the patio area. The dedication ceremony is planned during Victims' Rights Week on Thursday, April 26th at 12:15 pm. The garden project was approved by the Board on March 16, 1999.

> The garden will be developed in three stages with each stage being recognized during a Victims' Rights Week ceremony in April over a period of several years until the garden is complete. The development of the garden is primarily dependant upon donations. The District Attorney's Office and the Parks Department have worked closely together on planning and developing each stage in an appropriate order. The Board recently approved the addition of a fountain and fencing surrounding the garden during phase three.

The dates for National Victims' Rights Week - 2001 are April 22nd through April 28th. This week has been selected by the National Organization for Victim Assistance and is expected to be proclaimed as such by the President of the United States and the Governor of California. A Board Resolution proclaiming Victims' Rights Week in Stanislaus County is included in this Board agenda item.

ISSUE: The Board must determine the merits of approving use of the Courthouse lawn for the Victims' Garden dedication ceremony and proclaiming April 22nd through April 28th as Victims' Rights Week by Board Resolution.
