APPROVAL TO SET A PUBLIC HEARING FOR MAY 1, 2001, 9:25 A.M., TO CONSIDER STANISLAUS COUNTY FRANCHISE REFUSE COLLECTION RATE ADJUSTMENTS FOR DROP BOXES Page 2

DISCUSSION: The Department of Environmental Resources received refuse rate adjustment applications from Bertolotti Disposal, Gilton Solid Waste Management, Modesto Disposal Service and Turlock Scavenger. Department staff and the consulting firm of Hilton, Farnkopf & Hobson analyzed the applications. The analyses included thorough reviews of each hauler's reported revenues and expenditures, per the Stanislaus County Rate Adjustment Policy adopted by the Board on October 28, 1997. The recommended rate adjustments are shown in Attachment "A". The Department requests the Board to set a Public Hearing on May 1, 2001, to consider these adjustments. If approved, the rate increases noted in Attachment "A" would be effective June 1.

> Prior to authorizing any adjustments to refuse collection rates, the County Ordinance requires the Board to set and hold a Public Hearing. The time and date of the Public Hearing is required to be properly noticed in a local newspaper of general circulation. A copy of the proposed notice is included as an attachment, and will be published per the requirements.

> If the Board sets the Public Hearing as requested, Department staff will appear before the Board on May 1, and recommend the Stanislaus County Refuse Collection Rates for drop box service be adopted as shown in Attachment "A". Any franchise refuse service rate increases would affect only the customers in the unincorporated areas of the county.

POLICY ISSUE:

The Board is required to set and hold a Public Hearing prior to adjusting refuse collection rates. After the Public Hearing, the rates could be changed. Adjusting refuse service rates is consistent with the Board priority of delivering excellent community service.


