HOW DO WE GET TO PATTERSON?

Patterson is approximately 32 miles south of Tracy on I-5 or 27 miles north of Santa Nella on I-5 or 16 miles west of Turlock on West Main St.

> FROM THE BAY AREA:

Travel east on 580 to southbound I-5, Exit I-5 at the Patterson exit (Sperry Rd.), Travel east on Sperry Rd. to South 9th St., Turn left and go one mile to the Patterson Junior High School.

> FROM SACRAMENTO:

Travel southbound on I-5, Exit I-5 at the Patterson exit (Sperry Rd.), Travel east on Sperry Rd. to south 9th St., Turn left and go one mile to the Patterson Junior High School.

➤ FROM SAN JOSE/GILROY:

Travel Hwy 152 east to northbound I-5, Exit I-5 at the Patterson exit (Sperry Rd.), Travel east on Sperry Rd. to south 9th St., Turn left and go one mile to the Patterson Junior High School.

> FROM LOS ANGLES:


Travel northbound on I-5, Exit I-5 at the Patterson exit (Sperry Rd.), Travel east on Sperry Rd. to south 9th St., Turn left and go one mile to the Patterson Junior High School


FROM THE FRESNO AREA:
