PROCLAMATION OF THE MONTH OF MAY AS FOSTER CARE AWARENESS MONTH AND A DAY IN AUGUST 2001 AS FOSTER PARENT AND RELATIVE CARE PROVIDERS APPRECIATION DAY. Page 2

DISCUSSION: The Governor and the California Legislature have proclaimed May as Foster Care Awareness Month, calling attention to the special role that foster parents play in providing nurturing care to children who are separated from their birth families due to abuse, neglect, or exploitation.

In Stanislaus County, there are currently 133 foster homes licensed by the Stanislaus County Community Services Agency who are playing a vital role in serving children in this community. These foster parents and the Stanislaus County Foster Parent Association are committed to providing quality care to approximately 287 children who, for a variety of reasons, cannot be with their parents or relatives. This is a very important and often challenging service.

Several Foster Family Agencies that are licensed by the State provide care for approximately 160 Stanislaus County dependent children, with Group Homes serving an additional 91 children. These services are supervised by the Departments of Probation, Mental Health and the Community Services Agency.

In addition to the children placed in county and state licensed foster homes, approximately 213 children are placed with relatives. These are individuals who have extended their hearts and homes to care for children who, for a variety of reasons, cannot be with their parents or legal caretakers.

The Stanislaus County Community Services Agency and the Children's Services Advisory Committee are honoring the contribution of foster parents and relative care givers with a Foster Parent and Relative Care Provider Appreciation Picnic in August 2001. The resolution passed by the Board will be presented by the Agency to the President of the Foster Parent Association on behalf of the Foster Parents and a relative care provider at that time.

Again this year, The Community Services Agency, in collaboration with Probation and Mental Health departments, is planning a foster parent retreat day, to be held on May 31, 2001. The retreat will provide opportunities for foster parents and community providers to network, share ideas, and participate in team-building activities that will result in better services to children and families.

POLICY ISSUE:

Proclaiming May as Foster Care Awareness Month and a day in the month of August 2001 as Foster Parent and Relative Care Provider Appreciation Day honors the Foster Parents' and Relative Care Providers' contributions to the Board's priority of safe, healthy communities.
