APPROVAL TO INCREASE GENERAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS BY 2.96% EFFECTIVE 7/1/2001. THIS IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH WELFARE AND INSTITUTIONS CODE 17001.5. Page 2

DISCUSSION:

Welfare and Institutions Code, section 17001.5 authorizes counties to set General Assistance grant levels based on the 1991 poverty level, and states that counties may adjust the level annually to reflect changes in the AFDC (currently identified as Temporary Assistance for Needy Families [TANF] program). This method has been used in Stanislaus County since 1993 and has proven to be fair and effective. The alternative would be to determine the grant by "market-basket-survey" which would result in a much higher grant. The poverty level methodology meets the objective to assure that a one person General Assistance grant does not exceed the amount for one person in the TANF program.

All County Letter 00-50 directs counties to increase TANF payments by 2.96%. This increase was effective 10/01/00. As the County is obliged to consider increases annually, this request is made to be effective July 1, 2001, the beginning of the County's fiscal year. With Board approval, the grants for General Assistance recipients would increase as shown in the *attached table* effective 7/1/01.

We are requesting this increase prior to approval of the FY 2001/2002 budget to ensure all customers receive their grant increases in a timely manner and to avoid the additional workload and expense of issuing retroactive benefits.

POLICY ISSUE:

This request supports the Board's priority of safe, healthy communities by providing additional temporary support to the indigent community to defray the increase in the cost of basic necessities.

STAFFING IMPACT:

None.
