### DISCUSSION:

The above County Service Areas (CSA) were formed by resolutions of the Board of Supervisors. All the CSA's were formed to provide only extended storm drainage, except for CSA No. 10 - Salida, which provides extended services for: sheriff protection, library, landscape maintenance of parks and streets, and storm drainage maintenance.

Government Code Section 25210.77(A) requires that an Engineer's Report ("Report") containing a description of each parcel of real property receiving a particular extended service and the amount of the assessment for each parcel be prepared once a year and filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors. The Department of Public Works studied the above County Service Areas to estimate the annual cost of the extended services provided and filed the Reports with the Clerk of the Board on April 10, 2001. The annual assessments set forth in the Reports apply to the 2001/2002 tax year. The Reports shall become a part of the record of this proceeding.

The public hearing date was set by the Board of Supervisors on April 10, 2001. Notice of the public hearing was published in accordance with Section 6066 of the Government Code. Said notice stated that all persons will be afforded an opportunity to speak for or against the annual assessments.

DISCUSSION (Continued):

Each parcel within a specific CSA is being assessed at an equal rate based on type of land use. Due to the number of parcels within each CSA, the type of land use, and the cost to provide the extended service, the annual assessment is not the same for all CSA's. The 2001/2002 annual assessments are the same as the 2000/2001 annual assessments, therefore, the annual assessments conform with the requirements of Proposition No. 218. The annual assessments are levied without regard to property valuation.

The annual assessments will generate approximately \$333,145 in fiscal year 2001/2002 to provide extended County services within the CSA's. This amount includes an increase in annual revenue of approximately \$16,950 for CSA No. 10 due to two new subdivisions, Astoria Sound and Vizcaya Unit 1, being developed and assessed at the single family lot rate instead of the lower undeveloped residential rate. Although the revenue for CSA No. 10 has increased, the 2001/2002 annual assessment remains the same as the 2000/2001 annual assessment.

This action is consistent with the Board's policy of providing a safe, healthy

community.

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# COUNTY SERVICE AREA NO. 4 ANNUAL ENGINEER'S REPORT FISCAL YEAR 2001/2002

County Service Area No. 4 (CSA 4) was established in October, 1989, to provide extended storm drainage to the Bristol Glen subdivision. The boundary of CSA 4 is shown on Exhibit "A" that is attached hereto and made a part of this Engineer's Report.

Government Code Section 25210.77(A) requires that a written report containing a description of each parcel of real property receiving the particular extended service and the amount of the assessment for each parcel be prepared once a year and filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

There are 137 parcels within CSA 4, and each parcel receives equal benefit from the extended storm drainage. The extended storm drainage only provides a special benefit to the parcels within CSA 4, therefore, no general benefit has been assigned.

The formula that is being used to calculate the assessment is the total cost to operate and maintain the storm drain system divided equally by the number of parcels within CSA 4. This is the same formula that has been used since CSA 4 was formed.

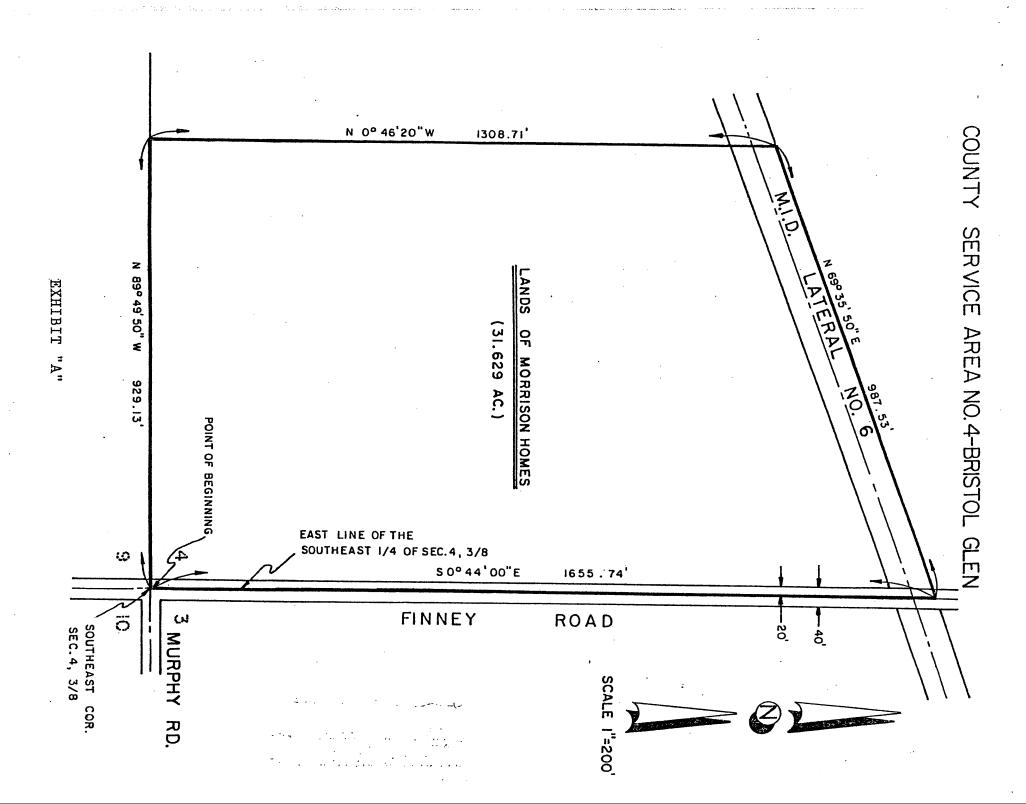

## COUNTY SERVICE AREA NO. 5 ANNUAL ENGINEER'S REPORT FISCAL YEAR 2001/2002

County Service Area No. 5 (CSA 5) was established in March, 1990, to provide extended storm drainage. The boundary of CSA 5 is shown on Exhibits "A1" and" A2" that are attached hereto and made a part of this Engineer's Report.

Government Code Section 25210.77(A) requires that a written report containing a description of each parcel of real property receiving the particular extended service and the amount of the assessment for each parcel be prepared once a year and filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

There are 192 parcels within CSA 5, and each parcel receives benefit from the extended storm drainage. The extended storm drainage only provides a special benefit to the parcels within CSA 5, therefore, no general benefit has been assigned. The basis of benefit for CSA 5 was determined to be equal for all Equivalent Dwelling Units within CSA 5. The method used to calculate the assessment is as follows:

Levy per E.D.U. = Total Balance to Levy ÷ Total E.D.U. Service Charge = Levy per E.D.U. x E.D.U. per Acre or Lot

County Service Area No. 11 (CSA 11) was established in April, 1991, to provide extended storm drainage to the Gilbert Road subdivision. The boundary of CSA 11 is shown on Exhibit "A" that is attached hereto and made a part of this Engineer's Report.

Government Code Section 25210.77(A) requires that a written report containing a description of each parcel of real property receiving the particular extended service and the amount of the assessment for each parcel be prepared once a year and filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

There are eight parcels within CSA 11, but only those six parcels with Gilbert Road frontage receives benefit from the extended storm drainage. The extended storm drainage only provides a special benefit to the parcels within CSA 11, therefore, no general benefit has been assigned.

The formula that is being used to calculate the assessment is the cost to grade the road shoulder divided by the lineal feet of Gilbert Road frontage within CSA 11. This per lineal foot cost is then multiplied by the number of lineal feet of the individual parcel. This is the same formula that has been use since CSA No. 11 was formed.
