APPROVAL TO SUBMIT 2001 LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT BLOCK GRANT APPLICATION TO BUREAU OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE TO ENHANCE CRIMINAL JUSTICE Page Two

DISCUSSION: For the sixth consecutive year, funding under the Local Law Enforcement Block Grants Program, established within the Bureau of Justice Assistance under the Omnibus Fiscal Year 1996 Appropriations Action, will be available for use in Stanislaus County. Funding may be used for seven purpose areas which address a wide variety of activities from increasing personnel and equipment resources for law enforcement, to developing and supporting programs to enhance effective criminal justice processes. The program is intended to provide the County with the opportunity to reduce crime and improve public safety through the implementation of diverse strategies ranging from enhancing the adjudication of adult and juvenile violent offenders and supporting the hiring of additional law enforcement officers, to establishing crime prevention programs that foster cooperation between community residents and law enforcement personnel.

> Funding in the amount of \$355,586 is available for use in Stanislaus County. A County match of \$39,510 is also required. The match must be in the form of cash and must be no less than 10 percent of total program costs. Funding the match obligation will be recommended as part of the final budget request. The District Attorney, Chief Probation Officer and Sheriff are putting together proposed options for use of this funding.

> If the Board of Supervisors concur, an application will be finalized with the Bureau of Justice Assistance for this funding and Board approval to adjust appropriations and authorize the use of this funding will be requested.

POLICY ISSUE: Board approval to apply for this entitlement funding is necessary prior to the obligation of program funds. Utilization of this funding will enhance criminal justice processes in our community; consistent with the Board's stated priority of ensuring a safe, healthy community.

STAFFING IMPACT:

While there are no recommendations to modify the Salary and Position Allocation Resolution at this time, depending upon the department requests a recommendation to add staff may be made upon acceptance of the Federal Grant award.
