DISCUSSION:

In 1991, the California Legislature passed the Oil Recycling Enhancement Act (Assembly Bill 2076, which was amended in 1992, by Assembly Bill 3073). One element of this legislation created a block grant fund for local jurisdictions to be administered by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) for expansion and promotion of waste oil recycling. Grants are available to jurisdictions statewide, either individually or collectively. Funds for this program are collected locally and returned to the local community through this block grant program.

On March 28, 2000, the Board approved the request of the Department of Environmental Resources to apply for the Sixth Cycle grant funds on a regional basis. Again, the Department is requesting authorization to apply for these grants funds on a regional basis. For the purposes of this Used Oil Recycling Block Grant Cycle application, the region will include the County and the cities of Hughson, Newman, Oakdale, Patterson, Riverbank, Turlock and Waterford. Stanislaus County has historically taken the lead role in this type of regional grant application and administration.

Programs paid for by this grant will help the County and the cities within this regional effort in meeting the goals and objectives of their Household Hazardous Waste Elements. This grant will provide funds for a three-year period with only the necessity to renew the agreement at the second and third year intervals. The language in the resolution will reflect that this is a multiple year grant.

During the first year of this process, 90 percent of the funds (\$75,065) will be advanced to the County with the final ten percent reimbursed at the conclusion of the grant. The term of the grant is three years, July 1, 2001 - June 30, 2004, and it allows for unused funds to be rolled forward. A copy of the grant application is included as Attachment "A". The proposed budget for fiscal year 2001-2002 is included as Attachment "B".

The Department is requesting authorization for the Director to sign the agreement to receive the funds in order to implement this grant. In addition, the Department is seeking budget authorization as well as approval for the Auditor to make the necessary departmental transfer, including rolling appropriations forward in fiscal years 2002-2003 and 2003-2004. This rollover provision to the next grant cycle was included in the instructional information by the California Integrated Waste Management Board.

POLICY ISSUE:

The Board should decide if the Department should apply for, administer and accept these grant funds. Such funding would assist the county and the cities within this regional effort in meeting waste reduction, recycling and education goals. The programs and activities associated with this grant are consistent with the Board priorities of ensuring a safe, healthy community, achieving multi-jurisdictional cooperation, promoting efficient government operations and delivering excellent community services.
