FISCAL IMPACT: (Continued)

Behavioral Health and Recovery Services will receive \$495,949 for fiscal year 2001/2002; \$389,500 for fiscal year 2002/2003; and \$283,051 for fiscal year 2003/2004. Department of Employment and Training will receive \$560,500 each of the three fiscal years. Appropriations and corresponding revenues for fiscal years 2002/2003 and 2003/2004 will be included in budget requests for those years. No impact to the County General Fund is anticipated.

DISCUSSION:

A service gap in the continuum of alcohol and drug services for adolescents was identified three years ago in the course of community meetings. Treatment services for adolescents were identified as one of the top ten priorities. Several efforts have partially addressed this service gap during the past three years, including programming for treatment services for adolescents at the Stanislaus Recovery Center.

DISCUSSION: (Continued)

In December 2000, Behavioral Health and Recovery Services and the Department of Employment and Training applied for a grant to provide alcohol and drug, mental health and employment services for youth ages 12 to 21 who are at risk or at high risk of becoming involved in the criminal justice system. The three-year grant is funded by the State Departments of Alcohol and Drug, Employment Development and Mental Health.

A collaborative planning process took place in preparing the grant application for the Safe and Healthy Futures Collaborative. Approximately 40 partners were involved in the planning process, including staff from Behavioral Health and Recovery Services, Department of Employment and Training, Probation Department, Modesto City Schools, Center for Human Services, Police Activities League, Stanislaus Youth Council, Parent Partners, Reality Program Alumni Association, Westside Alliance, Hispanic Leadership Council, King Kennedy Center, and the Advisory Board for Substance Abuse Programs.

In June 2001, Behavioral Health and Recovery Services, as the proposed lead agency, was notified of the successful grant award. Stanislaus County was one of seven counties selected statewide. The Stanislaus County Safe and Healthy Futures Collaborative will implement services under the grant award. The Collaborative's goals are to increase access to alcohol and drug, mental health and employment services for youth, to integrate and enhance existing services and to bridge gaps by providing new services in the targeted communities of Patterson, Ceres and Riverbank.

Services will be provided to youth who live in the three communities; are at risk of criminal involvement; are currently enrolled in alternative education and Seriously Emotionally Disturbed (SED) educational programs; and are in need of alcohol and drug or dual diagnosis (concurrent mental illness and substance abuse) services. Special focus will be youth whose alcohol, drug or mental health problems are preventing them from participating in employment-related activities.

Staff will be co-located and integrated into existing service sites at school and community programs in Patterson, Ceres and Riverbank. Services will include a wide spectrum of workforce investment and development strategies; one-on-one and group mentoring opportunities; life skills training; tutoring; recreational activities; alcohol and drug and mental health treatment, case management and after care. Families will be involved in treatment, and parent partners will provide support advocacy and mentoring to parents of youth in the program. Youth and their parents will be involved in the planning and implementation of the Collaborative.

DISCUSSION: (Continued)

Activities resulting from the project will achieve the following outcomes for at risk or high-risk youth in the communities of Patterson, Ceres and Riverbank:

- Increased access to alcohol and drug services
- Increased access to employment and work experience activities.
- Increased opportunities to attend and participate in leadership conferences and activities.
- Increased participation of families in treatment.
- Increased participation of at risk and high-risk youth in the Youth Council and planning activities.

POLICY ISSUES:

Acceptance of the grant award and implementation of services for at risk and high risk youth supports the Board of Supervisors' priorities of achieving multi-jurisdictional cooperation, ensure a safe and healthy community and facilitate economic development.

STAFFING IMPACT:
