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STAFF RECOMMEN-DATIONS (CONTINUED): 3. APPROVAL OF THE ATTACHED BUDGET JOURNAL REFLECTING CHANGES TO THE LIBRARY'S 2001/2002 LEGAL BUDGET.

DISCUSSION: The purpose of the Library's Children and Families Commission mini-grants are to address the Commission's strategic results of:

- Improved Child Development: Children Learning and Ready for School; and
- Improved Child Health: Healthy Children.

Summaries of the grants follow:

- During the month of February 2002, Children's Dental Health Month, all (13) Stanislaus County Libraries will offer a special story time focused on good dental hygiene. Working in cooperation with the Stanislaus Dental Society, the Library will offer a dental hygiene goodie bag, complete with a toothbrush, toothpaste and information for parents about the importance of beginning the practice of good dental hygiene at an early age. This program, expected to serve 600 children and their parents, addresses the strategic results of Improved Child Development: Children Learning and Ready for School, as well as Improved Child Health: Healthy Children.
- Top 10 Things You Need to Raise Your Baby is a brochure (in English and Spanish) for parents of newborns, which emphasizes the importance of reading to babies and young children. With an actual library card and application attached, parents can complete the application at their convenience, then bring the card and application to any Stanislaus County Library location for activation. This brochure will be distributed in new parent packets at all hospitals in Stanislaus County. The goal of this program is to increase the number of parents obtaining library cards for their infants. Top 10 Things You Need to Raise Your Baby addresses the strategic result of Improved Child Development: Children Learning and Ready for School.
- Your Child's Ticket to Success is a brochure (in English and Spanish) for parents of pre-school age children, which emphasizes the important role played by reading aloud to children in their future school success. With an actual library card and application attached, parents can complete the

application at their convenience, then bring the card and application to any Stanislaus County Library location for activation. This brochure will be distributed through the Stanislaus Literacy Center's Family Literacy Program, Headstart programs, pre-schools and daycare facilities. The goal of this program is to increase the number of parents obtaining library cards for their children 0 - 5. Your Child's Ticket to Success addresses the strategic result of Improved Child Development: Children Learning and Ready for School.

- Book Babies is a 12 week, one-on-one weekly activity for babies 0-12 months and their parents/caregivers. The program uses music, nursery rhymes and very simple stories to enhance early language development. Rhyme, rhythm and repetition are key elements, because the sound of language is especially important to infants who cannot yet focus on pictures. Currently, two sessions (fall and spring) are conducted at the Modesto Library annually. Children and Families Commission funding would enable us to expand the program to Turlock and Oakdale in Spring 2002. Book Babies addresses the strategic result of Improved Child Development: Children Learning and Ready for School.
- Literacy kits for children whose families are enrolled in the Stanislaus County Library's Read/Succeed Family Literacy Program are designed to stimulate learning through play at home. Kits will be individually designed to meet the needs of each child based on his or her skill level and age. Parents will be instructed in how to use the toys, books and tools to enhance their pre-schoolers language development. Follow up visits with each family will be conducted to determine the effectiveness of the kits and modifying their contents if necessary. The Family Literacy Program will be conducted at Kirschen Elementary School, Burbank Elementary School, Marshall Elementary School and the Salvation Army Child Development Center. Literacy kits for children in the family literacy program addresses the strategic result of Improved Child Development: Children Learning and Ready for School.
- POLICYApproval of this request will help fulfill the Board's goals of deliveringISSUES:excellent community service, achieving multi-jurisdictional cooperation and
modeling community leadership.

STAFFING Impact on current staff is limited to minimal training time. Personal services contractors will be retained for the Book Babies program and to implement the distribution of the literacy kits.

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
