NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE CONTRACTS FOR
MISCELLANEOUS CONSULTING SERVICES NEEDED FOR
THE DESIGN, SUCH AS SOIL TESTING, ESTIMATING,

FISCAL IMPACT: (CON'T)

The Library Master Plan identified projects to be completed over the next five years. For the Salida Library Project, the total cost for the acquisition of the building and the property was \$4,200,000, plus the cost of the County's share of title insurance and closing costs. Renovation of the building structure (painting, lighting, carpets, etc.) will cost approximately \$30 per square foot. When added to the costs of designers and other consultants, the total project cost for renovation will be approximately \$2,350,000.

Funding for one-time costs of the Salida Library Project will come from a combination of resources, including Public Facility Fees, various Library funds, and external financing. The Community Center portion of the project will be funded by \$750,000 in Tobacco Tax Settlement Funds, which was approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 12, 2001.

DISCUSSION:

On July 10, 2001, the Board of Supervisors approved the Library Facilities Master Plan. As part of that action, the Board authorized the Chief Executive Officer to negotiate and execute a real property agreement for the purchase of property in Salida to house a regional library. A community meeting was held on June 30, 2001, to review the County's overall service and facility needs in the Salida area. The public and members of the Salida Municipal Advisory Council (MAC) in attendance at the community forum were overwhelmingly supportive of this project. On September 18, 2001, the Board of Supervisors approved the purchase of the Breuners building and its renovation.

The Salida area is identified as having the greatest unmet need for Library services in Stanislaus County, due in part to the substantial growth of the northwest area of the county along the Highway 99 corridor. An existing branch library of 850 square feet, with a maximum occupancy of 10 persons is a leased facility in Salida, is inadequate to meet present needs. The Library Facilities Master Plan recommended development of a Regional Library in the Salida area as the highest priority.

An existing retail furniture showroom facility on Sisk Road adjacent to Broadway Avenue in Salida was available and presented a unique opportunity to create the County's first regional library facility envisioned in the Library Master Plan. The 56,146 square-foot facility is appropriately sized to permit development of a 25,000 square-foot library space, and a 5,000 square-foot community center meeting facility. Additionally, the Salida facility could accommodate the Library Technical Services unit, presently located at the Modesto Main Library. (Technical Services provides book processing, shipping, receiving, mending, and other "behind-the-scenes" support of the entire Library branch network.) Relocation of the Technical Services unit out of the Modesto Main Library will free up approximately 15,000 square feet of space for expanded public services at the Main Library at 1500 I Street in Modesto. The Salida "community center" space is intended to provide multiple purposes assembly facilities for the general public. No such facilities currently exist in the Salida area of the County.

Proposition 35 was implemented into law in January 2001. It requires that architectural and engineering services be procured by means of a fair, selection process. The services are to be engaged on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications plus at fair and reasonable prices.

The County's selection process included issuing request for qualifications. A standard was developed for submitting qualifications, establishing experience profiles, resume formats, and specific project information. The process defined selection criteria, and established two phases with a Screening Panel and a Selection Recommendation Panel that identified the highly-qualified firms and the firm with the best qualifications respectively.

The County has a need for architectural and engineering services for both small and large projects. A survey was performed by other counties to determine the types of professional service agreements being used. We found they use On Call contracts with purchase orders for small projects and prequalification of architects for large projects. In March of this year a RFQ solicitation included the prequalification of architects for large projects.

In addition, a RFQ solicitation was issued for separate On Call (small project) professional service needs. These were for services such as architecture, mechanical engineering, electrical engineering, structural engineering, testing, hazmat, estimating, and code consulting. Responses were received to the RFQ at the end of March. A total of 75 firms submitted for ten separate On Call contracts, and 44 architectural

firms submitted for the large project architect prequalifications. Screening Panels reviewed the documentation of all submissions and developed the highly-qualified short list (4-6 firms) for each of the ten On Call categories, and prequalified architect registers for the large project types.

The architectural register includes 27 firms, including both local and out of town firms. They are grouped as follows: General office, courts and related facilities, detention and residental facilities, hospital and clinics, and parking.

This professional services procurement fully satisfies the requirements of Proposition 35, and approval of the CEO to award the On Call contracts will provide the tools necessary as needed for small project professional services.

The Salida Library architectural services is the first to use the Large Project Register. On September 18, 2001, a letter requesting interest in the architectural services for the Salida Library was issued to the prequalified firms on the Architectural Register. Four firms expressed interest and interviews were held on October 31, 2001. Based on the interviews and the pricing, Architecture Plus, of Modesto, California is recommended for selection.

This report requests authorization to proceed with design and construction in accordance with the attached budget and schedule. Since the Board meeting on September 18, 2001, a more detailed scope has been developed after review and analysis of the project requirements plus existing conditions. The attached schedule, which forms part of the project (design and construction) plan for Board approval. Also provided is a breakdown of the total (remodel) project budget of \$2,350,000, including a construction budget of \$1,652,000. Negotiation and execution by the staff on behalf of the Board of the architectural contract to Architecture Plus is also requested. Staff will return to the Board for approval of the Contract Documents prior to bidding.

POLICY ISSUES:

Authorization for staff to proceed with the proposed remodel for the Salida Regional Library is consistent with the Board of Supervisors' direction toward implementation of the Library Master Plan recommendations, and the Board's goals and priorities to ensure a safe and healthy community, promote efficient government operations, and model community leadership.
