If the Board authorizes the collection of this \$1 fee, the Board must also direct the Auditor to conduct two reviews to verify that the funds generated by this fee are used only for the purpose of the social security number truncation program.

DISCUSSION:

AB 1168 recognizes the need for government to act to protect individual members of the public from identity theft. Many documents are recorded or filed with the County Recorder that contain social security numbers. The purpose of AB 1168 is to minimize the collection, use, storage and retention of social security numbers. Thus, AB 1168 has added the responsibility and authority to the County Recorder of truncating social security numbers to display only the last four digits on official records recorded during the time period from January 1, 1980 to the present and into the future. Recognizing that this is a new responsibility, the Bill authorizes the County Recorder to collect, upon authorization of the Board of Supervisors, an additional \$1 charge per document to pay for this new program through December 31, 2017. The bill allows County Recorder to request an extension of the fee from the Board of Supervisors if all of the costs associated with maintenance and support of this program have not been collected.

As a condition of approving the fee, the bill requires that the Board will direct the county auditor to conduct two reviews of the program to verify that the funds generated by this fee are used only for the purpose of this program. The bill requires that the Board to direct that the first review be completed not before June 1, 2012, or after December 31, 2013, and that the second review be completed not before June 1, 2017, or after December 31, 2017.

AB 1168 requires the County Recorder to establish a social security number (SSN) truncation program. More details about the program will be developed by the Recorder as discussions with vendors about the capabilities of their respective social security number redaction solutions are known. The SSN Truncation Program is planned to start on July 1, 2008. The Program will have two major elements.

First, the Clerk Recorder will create and redact historical records, those recorded from January 1, 1980 to June 30, 2008. This portion of the program has three major elements:

- 1. Records from 1980 through March of 1993 must have an electronic image created. The exact scope of this effort has not been developed but could include: creating electronic images from microfilm and creating electronic indexing of the records. It is estimated that there are 500,000 documents and 2,500,000 pages that must be scanned in this time period. This portion of the project is estimated to cost about \$364,000.
- 2. Records from March 1993 through June 30, 2008 must be reviewed and any missing images must be created from microfilm. It is estimated that there are 30,000 documents and 150,000 pages that must be scanned from microfilm. This portion of the project is estimated to cost about \$21,000.
- 3. Records from 1980 thru June 2008 must be examined for SSN and truncate them if found. There are an estimated 3,000,000 documents with an estimated 15,000,000 pages that must go through this process. This portion of the project is estimated to cost about \$748,800.

The Recorder plans to solicit bids and engage the professional services of specialists to complete the above three elements. The Department expects this project to take three years to complete at an estimated cost of \$1,133,800. The estimated cost for the Historical Records portion of the program is shown in Table 1 of Attachment A.

Second, the Clerk Recorder will establish new procedures to record documents that are being presented for recordation starting July 1, 2008 so that the social security number will be truncated from any document recorded prior to being released to the public. The exact procedures and methods to accomplish this effort have not been finalized. Once the exact scope of this portion of the project is defined, the Recorder will solicit bids for a system that will truncate social security numbers from recorded documents. The anticipated scope of this portion of the project is:

1. The records from July 1, 2008 forward through December 31, 2017 must be redacted/truncated using in-house staff. There will be an estimated 1,750,000 documents with an estimated 8,750,000 pages that must go through the truncation process and then be verified by staff during this time period. The requirement to redact/truncate SSNs will continue past 2017. Truncating the documents recorded through December 31, 2017 is estimated to cost about \$480,000.

Since the Bill was recently chaptered there has been little opportunity to develop any firm cost estimates for implementing this new responsibility added to the Recorder. No other Counties contacted have any firm cost estimates. However, informal discussions with our AtPac recording system vendor as well as Sonoma, Fresno, Merced, and Contra Costa counties have brought into focus some cost parameters that were used in developing our cost estimates in Attachment A. Those cost estimates are listed in the key at the bottom of Attachment A.

Other counties have been contacted to determine the fees currently collected and the status of their SSN Truncation program. The following table is a summary of fees charged by the comparison counties and some additional counties contacted to gather information about other social security truncation programs:

From the fee comparison tables, you can see that Stanislaus County Fees are in line with our comparison counties and that all counties contacted plan on implementing a fee to cover the costs of the SSN Truncation program.

Since the cost of this program is much higher than the initial revenue this new fee will generate, AB 1168 has authorized the Clerk Recorder Office to borrow funds to start the program and to repay the loan with the revenue generated from this new fee. Cost associated with this loan have not been considered in the cost and revenue tables in Attachment A. It is anticipated that the Clerk Recorder Office will borrow funds from the Modernization Trust fund and then repay the funds with the revenue collected.

Estimated cost and revenue for this program is listed in Attachment A.

POLICY ISSUES:

Board of Supervisors approval of this item supports the Board's priority of efficient delivery of public services.

STAFFING IMPACTS:

There is no additional staffing impact anticipated with this request. It is anticipated that SSN truncation verification can be accomplished with existing staff. The Assistant Clerk-Recorder will oversee this project as part of the regular duties of the Office.

ORDINANCE NO. C.S.
AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING CLERK RECORDER SCHEDULE FOR NEW FEES
THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF STANISLAUS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:
Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby amends chapters 4.34 to the Stanislaus County Code to read as follows.
Section 2. 4.34 CLERK'S FEES
4.34.010 Designated
N. To support the Social Security Number Truncation Program within the Clerk Recorder Department, each chargeable recorded document will be assessed a one dollar fee effective July 1, 2008 and continue through December 31, 2017.
Section 3. The Board of Supervisors hereby adopts the Clerk Recorder Department new fee of \$1 for each recorded document for the purpose of funding a social security number truncation program. The fee will take effect on July 1, 2008 and end on December 31, 2017.
Section 4. The Board of Supervisors hereby directs the Auditor to conduct two reviews of the Clerk Recorder's social security number truncation program to verify the funds are only being used for this program. The first review must be completed not before June 1, 2012, or after December 31, 2013, and that the second review be completed not before June 1, 2017, or after December 31, 2017.
Section 5. This ordinance shall be published once before the expiration of 15 days after passage of this ordinance, with the names of the members voting for and against the same, in the Modesto Bee, a newspaper published in the County of Stanislaus, State of California, and the ordinance shall take effect either (a) pursuant to section 25123 of the Government Code, 30 days after the date of publication, or (b) pursuant to section 66017 of the Government code, 60 days following the final action on the adoption of the fees or charges, whichever date occurs first.
