Approval to Purchase Three Replacement for the Agricultural Commissioner's Office Page 2

DISCUSSION:

On June 3, 2008, the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors approved the Stanislaus County Vehicle Replacement Plan. Included in this plan was the recommendation that funds in the amount of \$51,570 be returned to the Agricultural Commissioner's Office. This depreciation was collected by General Services Agency (GSA) – Fleet Services Division Vehicle Replacement Fund, for vehicles purchased by the Agricultural Commissioner's Office from 2004 to the present.

As a result of the recommendation, \$51,570 was recently transferred by the Auditor-Controller to the Agricultural Commissioner. The Department would like to utilize these funds in the manner originally intended and replace aged vehicles.

The County's standard criteria for vehicle replacement has been either ten years old, or 100,000 miles. The Department currently has a number of vehicles in its fleet that exceed one or both of these standards. The Department is requesting that these vehicle replacement funds be used to replace two 1993 pick-up trucks and one 1995 pick-up truck. One of the 1993 vehicles currently has over 100,000 miles and the other has approximately 75,000 miles. The 1995 vehicle mileage is approaching 100,000 miles. With these vehicle replacements, the cost of vehicle maintenance and repair is expected to decrease.

The new vehicles will be used in the Pest Detection program, a crucial program which detects insect pests before they cause infestation or damage to residential and agricultural areas. This program protects California agriculture, the local economy and homeowners' fruit-bearing trees and plants. Some of the insects which trappers try to detect are Caribbean Fruit Fly, Mexican Fruit Fly, Olive Fruit Fly, Oriental Fruit Fly, Mediterranean Fruit Fly, Melon Fruit Fly, Guava Fruit Fly, Gypsy Moth, and Japanese Beetle.

If approved by the Board of Supervisors, the Agricultural Commissioner will coordinate the purchase of the said vehicles with the General Services Agency – Purchasing Division. In order to ensure that these funds are appropriated for the purchase of the vehicles, the Department will establish a purchase order immediately upon receiving approval which will result in the year end carry-forward of the necessary appropriations. It is important to note that these purchases will not affect the Department plan to contribute \$10,000 above the requested 2% to the year-end fund balance. Furthermore, the recommended purchase would strengthen the Agricultural Commissioner's fleet of vehicles to an acceptable level in the event that no additional replacement of vehicles is possible in the upcoming years due to the County's fiscal position and local economic conditions.
