Approval to Declare Six County Vehicles Purchased by California Multi-Jurisdictional Methamphetamine Enforcement Team (CAL-MMET) Surplus and Authorize Sales of These Vehicles

DISCUSSION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to receive authority to declare six Sheriff's Department undercover vehicles as surplus, and authorize their sale. The proceeds from the sale will be used to purchase replacement vehicles when needed for the California Multi-Jurisdictional Methamphetamine Enforcement Team (Cal-MMET). These vehicles were purchased with Cal-MMET grant funding and became the property of the Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department.

Cal-MMET is now in its eighth year of working towards the goal of eliminating drug traffickers and enforcing drug laws. Cal-MMET works very closely with the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) task force and the Stanislaus Drug Enforcement Agency. These vehicles were purchased by the Cal-MMET program and are now high mileage, in need of repair, and have outlived their usefulness to the efforts of Cal-MMET. The list of vehicles to be auctioned follows:

The auction company will sell these vehicles. Auction costs will be deducted from the proceeds. An estimate of \$1,500 per vehicle was based off of sales of similar vehicles for a total of \$9,000. Upon receipt of these funds they should be placed in the Sheriff's Department Cal-MMET Fund 1780 to be used by Cal-MMET to purchase replacement vehicles.

POLICY ISSUES:

STAFFING IMPACT:
