On behalf of the Animal Advisory Board this letter is written in support of the resolution to proclaim February as "Spay & Neuter Month" and February 24, 2009 as "Spay Day in the County of Stanislaus." Further, the Animal Advisory Board recognizes and appreciates the efforts of the Humane Society of Stanislaus for their leadership and preparations for the upcoming events in February.

Spay Day USA was created in 1995 by the Doris Day Animal League and then combined their operations with the Humane Society of the United States in 2006.
