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#### **DISCUSSION:**

This item is submitted to the Board of Supervisors to authorize the purchase of a patient tracking system for five area hospitals. The funding is through the Fiscal Year 2007 (FY07) and Fiscal Year 2008 (FY08) Homeland Security Grants.

On October 23, 2007, the Board of Supervisors accepted the FY07 Homeland Security Grant. Included in this grant was Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS) funding totaling \$258,145. Health Services Agency (HSA) administers the MMRS grant and makes recommendations on the expenditure of its funding. In the original FY07 application, the MMRS funding was being used to develop Alternate Care Sites. By combining funding from the Fiscal Year 2006 Homeland Security Grant, HSA was able to fulfill the project of developing two alternate care sites and a point of distribution trailer. There is \$108,139 remaining in MMRS funding in the FY07 grant.

As part of the Fiscal Year 2008 application, \$67,382 was allocated for an electronic and web-enabled patient-people-pet-inventory tracking system. This system can be used for:

- Hospital Mass Casualty/Fatality Management
- Hospital Triage, Treatment and Transport
- Surge Capacity/Bed Tracking Management
- Family Reunification
- Pre-hospital Triage, Treatment and Transport

This patient tracking system augments one purchased by Public Health several years ago. To achieve interoperability between Public Health and the hospitals, to the new system should be compatible hardware and software to the existing system. The vendor for this system is Sydion LLC. As required by federal grant guidelines, the State Office of Homeland Security approved a sole source to allow the use of grant funding to purchase the tracking system from Sydion LLC. The Homeland Security Grant funding will purchase only the hardware (bar code scanners, computer, and software on handhelds) that can communicate with the enterprise system that is maintained by public health. These products are only available through Sydion. To purchase the system from another vendor would require replacement of the existing hardware and software used by Public Health at considerable additional cost.

The total cost is \$39,076 per hospital. The system will be purchased for Memorial Medical Center, Doctor's Medical Center, Modesto Medical Center—Kaiser Permanente, Oak Valley Hospital, and Emanuel Medical Center. Total cost including tax is \$195,380.

Within the allocated line items for this system, there is a total of \$175,521, leaving the project approximately \$20,000 short. Within the FY08 grant, \$50,000 was allocated for the purchase of a mobile morgue vehicle for the Sheriff – Coroner. After further

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research, it was determined the vehicle could not be purchased for under \$100,000. The Sheriff's Department and HSA concur in the recommendation to use a portion of the mobile morgue funding to complete the purchase of the patient tracking systems for the hospitals. It is anticipated that the mobile morgue will be purchased with a combination of FY08 and Fiscal Year 2009 (FY09) Homeland Security Grant (MMRS) funding. The FY09 grant application process will begin late spring this year.

#### **POLICY ISSUES:**

Acceptance of this grant supports the Board's priorities of *A safe community, A healthy community* and *Effective partnerships* by enhancing the ability of local jurisdictions to prevent, deter, respond to and recover from threats and incidents of terrorism and biological events.

#### STAFFING IMPACT:

There is no staffing impact associated with this grant.
