SUBJECT:

Approval to Set a Public Hearing on April 21, 2009, at 6:40 p.m., to Introduce and Waive the First Reading of an Ordinance to Amend Existing Fees for the Department of Environmental Resources

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

Set a public hearing on April 21, 2009, at 6:40 p.m., to introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance to amend existing fees for the Department of Environmental Resources.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The proposed fee adjustment would consist of an increase to the landfill tipping fee, the establishment of two minimum charges in the special handling and hard-to-handle waste categories, and the removal of Code Enforcement fees relative to the Mobile Home Park Program. If the proposed landfill fee adjustments are approved, the increase in revenues for the Department of Environmental Resources Fink Road Landfill is estimated to be approximately \$431,781 per year (average number of tons received in calendar year 2007 - 2008 = 143,927 tons x \$3/ton) for normal refuse. FISCAL IMPACT: (Continued)

In addition, a minimum charge of \$20 is proposed for loads of hard-to-handle waste, for consistency with non-friable asbestos which also requires special handling, and a minimum charge of \$50 for loads of six or more small dead animals, also for consistency with other dead animal handling charges. Revenues generated by these minimum charges are estimated to be approximately \$12,600 per year (2 loads/day x 300 days/year x \$20, plus 1 load/month x 12 months x \$50). The total revenue increase, therefore, will be approximately \$444,381. The deletion of the Mobile Home Park Program fees is appropriate given that the enforcement responsibility and associated costs has reverted back to the State of California – Department of Housing and Community Development.

DISCUSSION:

The Department of Environmental Resources (Department) charges fees for services it provides in the program areas of Solid Waste, Milk & Dairy, Hazardous Materials, Code Enforcement, Environmental Health, and Landfill. State law mandates that fees charged for services cannot exceed actual costs and must be used to pay the costs of running the programs. Additionally, State Realignment and County Match funding helps offset the costs that are not recovered through fees.

Annually, in preparation for the Proposed Budget, the Department evaluates the cost of services provided and the fees associated with programs administered. This process includes the consideration of new or additional fees, where appropriate, as well as modifications to existing fees in order to cover the cost of County services.

The Department had several fee increases in 2008, but this year is proposing to increase only the landfill tipping fee and set minimum charges in two landfill waste categories. There are no proposed fee changes for Solid Waste, Milk & Dairy, Hazardous Materials, or Environmental Health and it is the Department's goal to maintain a balanced budget by curbing expenditures where possible and not filling positions that become vacant. If the current economic downturn continues, however, and the Department can no longer meet its expenses through savings from attrition coupled with the use of fund balance, program needs will be re-evaluated and staffing levels may have to be adjusted.

Landfill

On March 4, 2009, the Department held two workshops (see Exhibit "A") to discuss the proposed Landfill fee changes with public customers and industry representatives. Information about the workshops was disseminated through a mail-out to all parties

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affected or potentially affected by the fees. In addition, workshop flyers were distributed to public customers visiting the Landfill. Three people attended the workshops and one telephone call was received regarding the workshop notice. Department staff reviewed the proposed changes and solicited input from representatives in attendance or that inquired about the process. No specific concerns were raised but questions were asked about the justification for the fee increase and how many notices were mailed out and to whom. The proposed fee schedule is attached as Exhibit "B."

The Fink Road Landfill is an enterprise fund that is fully funded through the collection of tipping fees. The Board of Supervisors receives its authority for collecting disposal fees from Government Code Section 25823 and Public Resources Code Section 40059. Capital improvement costs are incorporated into the tipping fee calculations and the Department is proposing fee adjustments to the tipping fee for normal refuse (i.e., municipal solid waste).

Staff is recommending that the per ton tipping fee for normal refuse be increased from \$30 per ton to \$33 per ton in order to cover increasing operational costs and capital improvements. Specifically, salaries and benefits costs have increased 13% since 2004, and the environmental monitoring and testing costs have increased over \$200,000 in the past two years at Fink Road Landfill alone. At the Geer Road Landfill, these costs are estimated to be approximately \$770,000 for Fiscal Year 2008-2009, compared to \$360,000 in 2004, or a 114% increase. Capital improvements currently underway at the Fink Road Landfill include the design and construction of the next waste management unit, Cell No. 5, at a cost of approximately \$5 million. In addition, the facility's compactor lease has come due and the unit needs to be replaced. Replacement costs are estimated at over \$1 million. Other fixed assets in need of replacement are two pick-up trucks and a water truck estimated at \$245,000.

The tipping fee has not been increased since July 1, 1997, at which time it increased \$3 per ton to \$40.25 per ton. Following this, the tipping fee was decreased to \$34 per ton on June 1, 2001, and again on January 1, 2002, to the current \$30 per ton. The current proposal would bring rates back to a level not seen since 1996 and are rates that are comparable to the current fees being charged in both San Joaquin and Merced County which are \$29.72 per ton (at the Foothill Landfill which takes limited volumes) and \$38.20 per ton (at the North County Landfill where a majority of their waste goes) and \$33.41 per ton, respectively.

Revenues generated by the proposed fee adjustment would be approximately \$431,781 per year (average number of tons received in calendar year 2007 - 2008 = 143,927 tons x \$3/ton). In addition, a minimum charge of \$20 is proposed for loads of hard-to-handle waste, for consistency with non-friable asbestos which also requires special handling, and a minimum charge of \$50 for loads of six or more small dead animals, also for consistency with other dead animal handling charges. Revenues generated by these

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minimum charges are estimated to be approximately \$12,600 per year (2 loads/day x 300 days/year x \$20, plus 1 load/month x 12 months x \$50).

Code Enforcement

Historically, the Board of Supervisors had exercised its option to assume the inspection and enforcement responsibilities of the Mobile Home Parks Act and Special Occupancy Parks Act although these responsibilities have been transferred among various County departments over the years. A recent evaluation of the program conducted by Department staff concluded that staffing requirements to properly administer the program well exceeded the revenue from fees for the program that are established by the California State Legislature. Given this, on October 28, 2008, the Board authorized the Department to relinquish its responsibility for this program back to the California Department of Housing and Community Development. The corresponding recommendation to delete the mobile home park fees is consistent with the relinquishment of this program.

Public Hearing

Prior to levying a new fee or increasing an existing fee, the County is required by Government Code Section 54985 *et seq.*, to hold a scheduled public hearing as part of a regularly scheduled meeting of the local agency. If approved, these fee increases will correspond with Fiscal Year 2009-2010, and will become effective on July 1, 2009.

POLICY ISSUES:

An ordinance of the Board of Supervisors is required to increase or establish fees for the Department of Environmental Resources. Further, the Board should determine if approving staff's recommendations are consistent with its priorities of a safe community, a healthy community, a well-planned infrastructure system, and the efficient delivery of public services.

STAFFING IMPACTS:

There are no staffing impacts associated with this item.

**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AMENDING
EXISTING FEES COLLECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF
ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES**

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF STANISALUS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Fees to be collected by the Department of Environmental Resources are adopted and amended as set forth in the Department of Environmental Resources Fee Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated by reference, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and is available for public inspection and copying in that office in accordance with the California Public Records Act.

Section 2. 
