Approval for the Chief Probation Officer to Apply for and Accept a Probation Specialized Units Program Grant from the California Emergency Management Agency to Provide Intensive Supervision Services to Repeat Domestic Violence Offenders

FISCAL IMPACT: (Continued)

The Probation Department will use existing resources to fund the \$15,222 in required match.

DISCUSSION:

For the seventh consecutive year, funding under the Federal Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) is available to enhance specialized units within Probation Departments in California to intensively supervise small caseloads of offenders of violent crimes including sexual assault, domestic violence, and stalking. The California Emergency Management Agency has since taken over administration of the grant and has extended the funding for an additional year. Board action is necessary in order to apply for seventh year continuation funding. The deadline for application is August 14, 2009.

These funds support the Stop Abusive and Violent Environments program, which provides the highest risk domestic violence offenders and their victims with a level of service that was not previously attainable through general supervision caseloads. The SAVE Officer supervises an average of 30 cases each month with each offender being contacted on a near weekly basis. The small caseload capacity allows the SAVE Officer to provide intense supervision and monitoring in order to reduce the likelihood of repeated acts of violence. The small caseload also allows the opportunity to provide increased services and safety to the victims of assigned cases. Regular contact is maintained with these victims to provide support and resource information.

POLICY ISSUE:

This grant will meet the Board's priority of A safe community by continuing the SAVE program that has proven effective in reducing the likelihood of repeated acts of violence among the highest risk domestic violence offenders.

STAFFING IMPACT:

There are no staffing impacts associated this grant application. Existing staff will perform the required project services.

Project Narrative

Problem Statement

Prior to the inception of the Probation Specialized Units program in 2003, the Stanislaus County Probation Department's three domestic violence probation officers supervised 424 felony domestic violence offenders, an average of 141 per officer. The Probation Specialized Units program in Stanislaus County commenced in February 2003, at which time 30 of the identified offenders were assigned to the Probation Specialized Units program. The supervisor having day-to-day responsibility for the project identified the active domestic violence probationers who fit the program's criteria for supervision. The probation officer assigned to the position continues to provide the victims and offenders a level of supervision that was not previously attainable with general supervision of domestic violence caseloads.

<u>Plan</u>

Due to the success of the Probation Specialized Units program over the past six years, alterations to the operational plan are not necessary. Objectives for the 2009/2010 fiscal year are to maintain a reduced high risk caseload of no more than 40 offenders; to provide intensive probation services to the assigned offenders; to continue to contact and provide victims with resources, referrals and support; to attempt weekly offender contacts in the community; and to maintain statistical results as required by the grant. Domestic violence offenders that continue to meet the criteria of the program will continue to receive a level of intensive supervision that was not attainable prior to the inception of the grant.

Implementation

Training: The assigned officer will be scheduled to attend ongoing domestic violence training. Training expenditures will continue to be paid for by the Probation Department.

Collaboration: The assigned officer will continue to participate in and provide monthly briefings to the Stanislaus County Family and Domestic Violence Coordinating Council (FDVCC). She will also serve on an additional FDVCC committee, which meets monthly to implement action plans for victims involved in particularly high-risk relationships. In addition, the assigned officer will continue to collaborate and partner with local law enforcement agencies in the arrests and revocations of offenders who have violated the terms and conditions of probation.

Additional Duties: The assigned officer is now tasked with assisting in the recertification of treatment providers, including observance of instructors and reporting on attendee response.

- District Attorney Division of Victim Services

Budget Narrative

The enclosed budget detail outlines the anticipated 2009/2010 expenditures for the Probation Specialized Units Program. A detailed summary of each of the designated budget areas and the related expenses for the program are contained herein.

Personal Services

The grant funds will pay for a portion of the salary and benefits of one full time Deputy Probation Officer II. This officer will continue to serve as the supervision officer for offenders assigned to the program and the primary point of contact for victims and community resources. A full time position is necessary in order to meet the guideline that the assigned officer attempt weekly contacts with each assigned offender. The cost to cover the portions of the salary and benefits not covered by the grant will be incurred by the Probation Department. The funds provided by this program will allow for the continued intensive supervision of those offenders assessed as having the greatest level of threat to repeats acts of violence upon their victims.

The officer assigned to the position graduated from CSU Stanislaus in 2004 with a Bachelor of Arts degree. She has been employed by the Probation Department since December 2004, serving as a Probation Corrections Officer and Deputy Probation Officer. She has been assigned to the supervision of adult offenders since April 2005. During her tenure with the probation department, she has participated in 497 hours of STC certified training and an additional 53 hours of non-certified training. Training she has participated in includes the following:

Family and Domestic Violence Conference, Firearms, Ethics, Adult Law, Defensive Tactics, Defensive Driving, Field Safety, Gang Trends, and Critical Incident Response. She is currently assigned to the Violent Offender supervision unit. Duties include the field supervision of high risk domestic violence offenders. Each of her duties are directly related to the PSU grant requirements including, weekly contacts with offenders and monthly contacts with victims.

7. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The grant will continue to partially fund a Deputy Probation Officer to provide intensive probation services and victim services to no more than 40 domestic violence offenders on felony probation. The targeted population continues to be probationers who are repeat offenders and pose the greatest threats to their victims and the community. All program participants are residents of Stanislaus County.

8. PROBLEM STATEMENT

Prior to the inception of the Probation Specialized Units program, the Stanislaus County Probation Department's three domestic violence probation officers supervised 424 felony domestic violence offenders, an average of 141 per officer. The Probation Specialized Units Program in Stanislaus County commenced in February 2003, at which time 30 of the identified offenders were assigned to the Probation Specialized Units program. The supervisor having day-to-day responsibility for the project identified the active domestic violence probationers who fit the program's criteria for supervision. The probation officer assigned to the position continues to provide the victims and offenders a level of supervision that was not previously attainable with general supervision of domestic violence caseloads.

9. OBJECTIVES

Objectives for the 2009/2010 fiscal year are to maintain a reduced high risk caseload of no more than 40 offenders; to provide intensive probation services to the assigned offenders; to continue to contact and provide victims with resources, referrals and support; to conduct weekly offender contacts in the office, field and at counseling programs; and to maintain statistical results as required by the grant. Domestic violence offenders who continue to meet the criteria of the program will continue to receive a level of intensive supervision that was not previously attainable.

10. ACTIVITIES								
Continued weekly contacts with offenders and victims at residences, the Probation Department, counseling agencies, and at work. Intensive supervision will include, when applicable, probation searches, drug testing, probation revocations, arrests, probation reports and service referrals to, and intervention with, the victim and family.
