SUBJECT:

Approval to Amend the Agreement with the Stanislaus County Superior Court for Court Security Services

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Authorize the Sheriff to amend the Agreement with the Stanislaus County Superior Court for the Sheriff to provide Court Security Services for the Court.
- 2. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer and Sheriff to sign the Amendment and any and all additional documents to implement this Agreement.
- 3. Amend the Salary and Position Allocation Resolution to reflect the recommended changes as outlined in the Staffing Impacts section, to be effective the start of the first pay period after Board approval.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

Pursuant to Government Code §68106 the Administrative Office of the Courts has ordered all courts closed on the third Wednesday of every month from September of 2009 through June of 2010. This is known as the statewide courts furlough. Section 68106(b)(6) requires that during those months effected by the statewide closure, the County shall reduce by 4.62 percent the "total expense charged to and reimbursed by Superior Court" for security services, and the Superior Court will pay that reduced amount to the County. Approval to Amend the Agreement with the Stanislaus County Superior Court for Court Security Services

# FISCAL IMPACT (CONTINUED):

In the 2009-2010 Final Budget the Court Security Budget was adjusted to include a decrease in appropriations of \$145,163 to reflect the decrease in revenue from the Superior Court. The total amount of anticipated expenditures for Fiscal Year 2009-2010 in Court Security is \$3,745,273 balanced with \$3,625,301 of estimated revenue received from charges to the Court and Child Support Services and a \$119,972 General Fund contribution. The Superior Court, pursuant to this agreement, will be billed on a monthly basis and pay to the County this revised amount. There is no impact to the General Fund as a result of the decrease in revenue from the Superior Court.

## DISCUSSION:

Government Code section §77212.5 provides that the Superior Court must enter into an agreement with the Sheriff regarding the provision of security services that are provided after July 1, 1999. On December 4, 2007 this Board approved a new agreement between the County and the Superior Court for the period of July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2010. This agreement is reflective of the Trial Court Funding Act of 1997 as governed by Rule 810 of the California Rules of Court as in effect on July 1, 1996.

In July of 2009, the Legislature enacted Government Code §68106 to address the closure of all California courts as a budget savings measure. This poorly drafted legislation gave all of the leverage to the Courts and put the Counties in the untenable position of having to cut costs, yet maintain service levels.

Pursuant to Government Code §68106 the Administrative Office of the Courts has ordered all courts closed on the third Wednesday of every month from September of 2009 through June of 2010. This is known as the statewide courts furlough. Section 68106(b)(6) requires that during those months effected by the statewide closure, the County shall reduce by 4.62 percent the "total expense charged to and reimbursed by Superior Court" for security services, and the Superior Court will pay that reduced amount to the County.

In order to meet this 4.62 percent reduction, the Sheriff's Department met with Superior Court staff to discuss an amendment to the Agreement. The parties reached an agreement that staffing levels be modified. Specifically, during furlough months, the Sheriff's Department will reduce the number of dedicated Deputy Sheriff and Deputy Sheriff - Custodial positions from 13 and 14 to 12 and 13, respectively; and increase staffing of the Sheriff's Lieutenant position from 1/2 time to 2/3 time. This increase does not result in additional cost as the Lieutenant classification is management and the position is filled by a full time employee. As a result of the reduction in the number of Sheriff Deputies assigned to Court Security, the Department is requesting to unfund one of the vacant positions. The other position was previously unfunded in the Final Budget. The Superior Court has agreed to this staffing reduction on the condition that the level of services provided to the Superior Court when the Superior Court is open will not be negatively impacted by this adjustment in security personnel.

Approval to Amend the Agreement with the Stanislaus County Superior Court for Court Security Services

If the Superior Court determines that the level of security services provided when the Superior Court is open have been negatively impacted by the staffing changes, the Sheriff's Department will propose alternatives for correction, such as adjusting staffing levels.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In July of 2009, the Legislature enacted Government Code § 68106 which addresses the closure of courts on the third Wednesday of every month from September of 2009 through June of 2010 (hereafter "furlough"). Section 68106(b)(6) requires that during those months effected by the statewide furlough, the County / Sheriff's Department shall reduce by 4.62 percent the "total expense charged to and reimbursed by Superior Court" for security services, and the Superior Court will pay that reduced amount to the County / Sheriff's Department has proposed that staffing levels be modified. Specifically, during furlough months, the Sheriff's Department will reduce the number of dedicated Sheriff's Deputy and Custodial Deputy positions to 12 and 13, respectively; and increase staffing of the Sheriff's Lieutenant position from 1/2 time to 2/3 time, as reflected in this table. The Superior Court's agreement to this staffing reduction is subject to the condition that the level of services provided to the Superior Court determines that the level of security services provided when the Superior Court is open has been negatively impacted by the staffing changes, the Sheriff's Department shall propose alternatives for correction, such as adjusting staffing levels. The Sheriff's Department alternatives approved by the Superior Court.

This table reflects the impact of that 4.62% reduction on the Superior Court expenses.
