DISCUSSION:

In 1988, pursuant to County of Stanislaus Ordinances 270 and 278, the Board of Supervisors authorized a Fair Hearing Board composed of an attorney, a physician, and a registered nurse to serve for the original terms of one, two, and three years, respectively, with subsequent terms of three years each for all members.

The Fair Hearing panel hears formal patient appeals resulting from eligibility determination or reflected treatment authorization requests that deny Medically Indigent Adult program eligibility or services requested which are outside the program's eligibility policies or scope of benefits. The terms for the previous appointments of these Fair Hearing panel positions require authorization by the Board of Supervisors to be renewed. The incumbents are highly qualified, objective and have indicated a strong interest in serving an additional term on this panel.

POLICY ISSUES:

The program promotes the Board of Supervisors' priority of *A healthy community and Efficient delivery of public services* as it provides community based review of administrative decisions to ensure fairness and appropriate expenditures related to eligibility medical necessity and benefits.
