Approval to Introduce and Waive the First Reading of an Ordinance to Amend Title 11, Section 11.08.020 of the Stanislaus County Code, Adding No Parking Zones on Reno Avenue, Santa Fe Avenue and Eleanor Avenue in the Stanislaus County Unincorporated Areas

DISCUSSION:

The Department of Public Works has received several requests for the installation of No Parking Zones at several unincorporated areas of Stanislaus County (Empire, Riverbank, and Modesto). The following is a summary of the requests received:

Reno Avenue (Modesto Area): Mike Cassle, the business owner of Cassle Garage Door Company on 1236 Reno Avenue, has requested a No Parking Anytime Zone. Vehicles parking in front of the business cause a sight visibility problem for the customers entering and exiting the driveways. The parked vehicles also cause a problem for the delivery trucks entering and exiting the driveways.

<u>Santa Fe Avenue (Empire Area)</u>: Vincent Lane, property owner at 796 Santa Fe Avenue, requested a No Parking Anytime Zone in front of his property. Vehicles parking on the east side of Santa Fe Avenue are causing a sight visibility problem at his driveway.

Eleanor Avenue (Riverbank area): John Stark, property owner of 4778 Mesa Drive, and Rick John, Director of Maintenance, Operations and Transportation of Riverbank Unified School District, requested a No Parking Anytime Zone in front of this property. Recently, a Riverbank Elementary school was built at this location. Parents are parking their vehicles along the west side of Mr. Stark's property on Eleanor Avenue and allowing their student(s) to cross the street at mid-block. This is an unsafe condition not only for the student but the parents who are parking along the shoulder of the roadway.

The Department of Public Works, Traffic Engineering staff has studied and field-reviewed each location. The Department recommends that No Parking Anytime Zones be installed at these locations to help improve traffic safety. No parking zones on Santa Fe Avenue and Reno Avenue will alleviate sight restrictions at the driveways. The no parking zone on Eleanor Avenue, across from the school, will prevent the parents from dropping off their students at a mid-block location.

The proposed ordinance code additions and revisions are recommended by the Public Works Department and approved as to form by County Counsel. Therefore, it is recommended that the Board of Supervisors introduce the ordinance and waive the reading thereof.

POLICY ISSUES:

The Board of Supervisors should consider if this action is consistent with its priorities of providing a safe community, a healthy community and a well planned infrastructure system. California Vehicle Code 22506 requires Board approval to change parking zones.

STAFFING IMPACT:

There is no staffing impact associated with this item.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING STANISLAUS COUNTY CODE, SECTION 11.08.020 RELATING TO NO PARKING ZONES ON RENO AVENUE, SANTA FE AVENUE AND ELEANOR AVENUE IN THE VARIOUS UNINCORPORATED AREAS

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF STANISLAUS ORDAINS AS **FOLLOWS:**

Section 1.	Amend the Stanislaus County Code, Title 11, Chapter 11.08, Section 11.08.020 (No Parking Zone) to add Subsection 531 (Reno Avenue), Subsection 532 (Santa Fe Avenue), and Subsection 533 (Eleanor Avenue) as follows:
"531.	Reno Avenue. On the east side of Reno Avenue from a point 290 feet south of its intersection thereof with Woodland Avenue, south 138 feet to a point 428 feet south of the intersection.
532.	Santa Fe Avenue. On the east side of Santa Fe Avenue from a point 2400 feet south of its intersection thereof with South Avenue, south 350 feet to a point 2750 feet south of said intersection.
533.	Eleanor Avenue. On the west side of Eleanor Avenue from its intersection thereof with Mesa Drive to a point 230 feet south of the intersection."
Section 2.	This ordinance shall take effect 30 days from and after the date of its passage, and before the expiration of 15 days after its passage, it shall be published once with the names of the members voting for and against the same in the Modesto Bee, a newspaper in the County of Stanislaus, State of California.
