DISCUSSION:

Throughout the course of a year, many items are donated to the Stanislaus County Library which may not be appropriate to include in the collection due to age or condition. Materials which are no longer useful or outdated are also pulled from the collection. The library recycles most of these items into its used book sale. Currently, the Library sells them for 25 cents per paperback and 50 cents per hardbound volume and realizes a profit of approximately \$12,000 per year. The money is used to fund Library programs and support operations. The used book fees have not been adjusted for at least six years, yet costs associated with sorting the materials and restocking the inventory on an ongoing basis have increased during those years. The Library has also received many comments from customers asking why the prices are so low. Stockton-San Joaquin libraries charge 50 cents to \$5 per hardback book and 50 cents to \$2.50 per paperback book. Sacramento and Kern County Libraries both charge \$1 per hardback book and 50 cents per paperback book. Solano County Library charges 50 cents per inch to \$15.00 per yard. Locally, the prices of used hardback books and paperback books have doubled in the last few years. Adjusting the cost of a paperback book to 50 cents per book and a hardbound book to \$1.00 per book would result in a possible annual revenue increase of \$12,000 to the library.

POLICY ISSUE:

The law requires the Board of Supervisors hold a Public Hearing whenever a fee increase is requested by the Stanislaus County Library. This item is consistent with the Board's goals of promoting efficient delivery of public services.

There are no staffing impacts associated with this item.
