DISCUSSION:

All appeals of the Stanislaus County Planning Commission's Decision are filed with the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors. Upon receiving an appeal, the Board of Supervisors places an item setting a public hearing date and time on their agenda for consideration. Once a public hearing date is approved, the Clerk of the Board is required to publish a Notice of Public Hearing in a newspaper of general circulation. The Planning and Community Development Department notifies surrounding property owners by mail, and prepares the public hearing agenda item.

On March 4, 2010, the Planning Commission, based on the inability to make the necessary findings, denied Use Permit Application No. 2009-10, Catholic Cemetery Dakota Avenue. This is a request to develop a cemetery in 4 phases on a 25.33-acre parcel in the A-2-40 (General Agriculture) zoning district. Each phase will take approximately 20 years to reach capacity. The project site is located east of Dakota Avenue, west of Highway 99, north of Beckwith Road, in the Modesto area.

POLICY ISSUE:


Setting a public hearing to consider an appeal of the Planning Commission's decision is consistent with the Board's priority of a well-planned infrastructure system.


