Approval to Accept the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Justice Assistance Grant -Offender Treatment Recovery Act Program Funds Effective October 1, 2009 through March 31, 2011 Page 2

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Behavioral Health and Recovery Services is requesting authorization to accept \$642,022 in funding from the California Emergency Management Agency to provide substance abuse treatment for criminal offenders convicted of nonviolent drug offenses who are sentenced under Penal Code 1210.1 or Penal Code 3036.1.

During the State Budget process for Fiscal Year 2009-2010, the Legislature eliminated funding for the Substance Abuse and Crime Prevention Act (Proposition 36). Proposition 36 enabled counties to provide substance use disorder services to offenders of certain crimes in lieu of incarceration. Even though the funding was eliminated, the initiative passed by the voters in 2000 requiring that these services be offered remains intact.

The State did maintain the funding provided through the Substance Abuse Offender Treatment Program through Fiscal year 2009-2010. This program was enacted in 2006 to expand and enhance Proposition 36 programming. The goal of the Offender Treatment Program funding is to improve offender accountability; increase participation, retention and completion rates; and expand treatment services. In Fiscal Year 2008–2009, Offender Treatment Program funding was approximately 17% of the total funding for Proposition 36 and Offender Treatment Program combined. Thus, without Proposition 36 funding, very little of the original purpose of Offender Treatment Program funding could be achieved.

In an effort to augment Offender Treatment Program funding, the Fiscal Year 2009 Amended State Budget Act required California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA) to allocate a portion of its one-time American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds to be used to provide substance use disorder treatment for criminal offenders who meet the criteria established for Proposition 36/Offender Treatment Program. CalEMA is distributing these funds in conjunction with the California Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs; however, CalEMA will provide oversight of these funds. The Justice Assistance Grant requirements mirror those of the Offender Treatment Program and include the following:

- The establishment and maintenance of a dedicated Court calendar with regularly scheduled reviews of treatment progress for persons ordered to drug treatment;
- The existence or establishment of a Drug Court model, and a willingness to accept defendants who are likely to be committed to state prison;
- The establishment and maintenance of protocols for the use of drug testing to monitor offenders' progress in treatment;

- The establishment and maintenance of protocols for assessing offenders' treatment needs and the placement of offenders at the appropriate level of treatment; and
- The establishment and maintenance of protocols for enhancing the overall effectiveness of services to eligible offenders.

The current Offender Treatment Program, which is a collaboration between Behavioral Health and Recovery Services, the Probation Department, and Superior Court, meets all of the required criteria to maintain this funding.

As part of the Federal Stimulus funding, the grant requires that staff supported by Justice Assistant Grant – Offender Treatment Program funding must be either new hires or employees who were terminated as a result of funding loss. Behavioral Health and Recovery Services was able to rehire, on an extra help basis, a Behavioral Health Specialist (substance abuse counselor) laid off as a result of the Fiscal Year 2009–2010 reductions in alcohol and other drug funding. The Department also is proposing to hire a part-time, extra help Staff Services Analyst to meet the data collection needs of this grant. The balance of the funding will be used to enhance treatment options, including residential treatment and outpatient services at Stanislaus Recovery Center.

The Department is now requesting that the Behavioral Health Director be authorized to accept these funds and execute the program within the guidelines established by CalEMA and the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

## **POLICY ISSUE:**

Approval of this agenda item will meet the Board's priorities of *A healthy community* and *Effective partnerships* by maximizing State funding to address the need expressed by the Community Health Survey for additional substance abuse services in Stanislaus County.

#### STAFFING IMPACT:

Justice Assistance Grant funding will be used to fund an extra help Behavioral Health Specialist and a part-time, extra help Staff Services Analyst.
