Approval to Accept Waste Tire Cleanup and Amnesty Event Grant Funds from the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery for Fiscal Year 2010-2011 to Promote the Cleanup and Recycling of Waste Tires

DISCUSSION:

The State of California generates almost 39 million waste tires annually. Although nearly three-quarters of all discarded tires are recycled in the State, the remainder poses an annual 10.5 million tire disposal challenge for cities and counties. The illegal disposal or stockpiling of tires in the State is a problem that ranks in the top tier in the nation.

The illegal disposal of tires is an ongoing problem in Stanislaus County. In many areas, tires are dumped in large quantities. These occurrences not only create blight and health concerns, they also obstruct emergency vehicles from driving through alleys, present fire hazards, and can attract mosquitoes and other vectors that spread disease.

The California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle, formerly the California Integrated Waste Management Board), Waste Tire Cleanup and Amnesty Event Grant Program (TCA-6), was established to address this growing problem of the unlawful disposal of waste tires. The funds come from a fee of \$1.75 collected on the retail sale of every new tire sold in California. CalRecycle has allocated \$2 million for competitive grants for Fiscal Year 2010-2011 for this purpose.

This grant will focus on two critical areas: 1) the disposal costs for cleaning up illegally dumped tires in the unincorporated areas through the County's roadside clean-up program; and 2) conducting waste tire amnesty collection events within the participating cities and the unincorporated County.

The clean-up (disposal) portion of this grant will be used to reimburse the County for its cost to recycle the over 3,000 waste tires collected on the County's roadways each year. The tire amnesty section will reimburse each participating jurisdiction for advertising, labor, and recycling costs associated with holding tire amnesty events. Events will be held in each participating city and three events will be held in various locations throughout the unincorporated area.

The amnesty events will be conducted either at a central drop-off point where individuals will deliver tires or through a voucher system. The voucher system would provide residents with a coupon that would allow them to take their tires to a designated transfer station. The County will add a voucher program in place of one of the four amnesty events held in the previous grant. Central drop-off points are typically used when events are held in a city or within a particular segment of the unincorporated County. For events that canvass a larger geographic area, a voucher system works best.

On January 26, 2010, the Board of Supervisors granted approval to the Department of Environmental Resources (Department) to apply for the 6th Cycle grant funds and adopted a resolution authorizing Stanislaus County to be the lead jurisdiction for the Waste Tire Clean-up and Amnesty Event Grant on behalf of itself and the following participants: the cities of Hughson, Newman, Oakdale, Patterson, Riverbank, Turlock, and Waterford.

On May 7, 2010, the Department received correspondence (Attachment "A") from CalRecycle indicating successful award of the 6th Cycle Tire Clean-up and Amnesty Event Grant (TCA-6) in the amount of \$45,494 for Fiscal Year 2010-2011.

POLICY ISSUE:

The Board of Supervisors should determine if accepting Waste Tire Clean-up and Amnesty Event Grant funds from CalRecycle is consistent with the Board's priorities of a safe community, a healthy community, effective partnerships, and the efficient delivery of public services. Such funding would assist the County and the participating cities within this region in their efforts to safely manage the large number of waste tires generated each year.
