Approval to Proclaim November 15, 2010, as "America Recycles Day" in Stanislaus County

DISCUSSION:

"America Recycles Day," a campaign instituted by the National Recycling Coalition, is the only nationally recognized day dedicated to encouraging Americans to recycle and buy recycled products. Since its inception in 1997, the America Recycles Day campaign has grown to include millions of Americans pledging to increase their recycling habits at home and work, and to buy products made with recycled materials. Residents in every state of the nation participate in America Recycles Day events. Held annually on November 15th, millions of people become better informed as a result of the national America Recycles Day campaign. The Board of Supervisors has proclaimed November 15th "America Recycles Day" for the past several years.

The Department of Environmental Resources (Department) supports the purpose set forth by America Recycles Day, which is to promote the social, environmental, and economic benefits of recycling and to encourage more people to join the movement toward creating a better natural environment. Departmental outreach efforts encourage individuals, businesses, communities, and government agencies to work together as good stewards of our natural resources. Using resources wisely will help preserve and improve our environment and build a stronger economy.

In the "spirit" of America Recycles Day, the Department this year is sponsoring the first Green Ideas Expo; a local community event highlighting how the recycling and reuse of wastes originally destined for disposal can be made into new products and commodities. The Green Ideas Expo will be held at Harvest Hall, 3800 Cornucopia Way, Modesto, on November 4, 2010, from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. The goal of the event is to create a synergistic effect by inspiring new green ideas, innovation, and networking opportunities between businesses. The public will have the opportunity to discover new green ideas and innovations, and learn how green technology is used by businesses. Guest speakers representing the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery and local businesses will be featured at the event.

POLICY ISSUE:

Approval of this agenda item proclaiming November 15, 2010, as "America Recycles Day" is consistent with the Board's priorities of A Healthy Community, Effective Partnerships, and A Well Planned Infrastructure System. It provides a program that supports the Department's mission to promote a safe and healthy environment and improve the quality of life in the community through a balance of science, education, partnerships, and environmental regulation.
