Approval to Accept Used Oil Payment Program Funds from the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery for Fiscal Years 2010-2011 and 2011-2012

FISCAL IMPACT (Continued):

Since it is anticipated that these funds will be spent in Fiscal Year 2011-2012, associated appropriations will be submitted in the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Proposed Budget.

DISCUSSION:

The California Oil Recycling Act (Act) provides for, among other things, funding to assist local governments in developing and maintaining ongoing used oil and used oil filter collection/recycling programs for their communities. In 2009, Senate Bill 546 (Lowenthal) was enacted which made various changes to the Act, including: changing the funding from a reimbursable grant program (formerly known as the Used Oil Block Grant Program, or UBG) to a payment program (now referred to as the Used Oil Payment Program, or OPP), increasing the statewide funding from \$10 million to \$11 million per year, and encouraging local governments to use approximately 10 percent of their individual funding on the collection and recycling of used oil filters.

The OPP is non-competitive and provides funds to establish and maintain used oil and used oil filter collection/recycling programs. Actual budget amounts are determined annually as part of the State budget process. Allocation to payment recipients is calculated on a per capita basis using the Department of Finance's population statistics. Programs paid for by this funding will help Stanislaus County and the participating cities meet the goals and objectives of their Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Elements such as continuing educational efforts aimed at diverting HHW from the waste stream and expanding used oil and used oil filter recycling opportunities.

On June 29, 2010, the Board of Supervisors granted approval to the Department of Environmental Resources (Department) to apply for the Used Oil Payment Program funds for fiscal years 2010-2011 and 2011-2012, and adopted a resolution authorizing Stanislaus County to be the lead jurisdiction for the Used Oil Payment Program on behalf of itself and the following participating cities: Hughson, Newman, Oakdale, Patterson, Riverbank, Turlock, and Waterford.

At the time of the OPP application, the award amount was estimated not to exceed \$86,900. On October 1, 2010, however, the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery notified the Department that additional funds in the amount of \$4,971 were being awarded, bringing the total award to \$91,871.

POLICY ISSUE:

Approval of this agenda item to accept Used Oil Payment Program funds for fiscal years 2010-2011 through 2011-2012, is consistent with the Board's priorities of A Safe Community, A Healthy Community, and Effective Partnerships. It provides a program that supports the Department's mission to promote a safe and healthy environment and improve the quality of life in the community through a balance of science, education, partnerships, and environmental regulation.
