FISCAL IMPACT:

The District's assessment for Fiscal Year 2010-2011 is \$24.10 per parcel; if approved, the new assessment for Fiscal Year 2011-2012 will be \$45.89 per parcel.

One time costs associated with this project include staff project time for the ballot procedure, Engineer's Report, public meetings, and coordination with Modesto Irrigation District. A portion of these costs were approved for coverage through funding from the Community Development Fund (Initiate Proceeding on 1/11/2011 - Staff recommendation #3 approved the use of up to \$5,600) and is consistent with the goal of (Continued on Page 2)

FISCAL IMPACT (Continued):

providing funding for "one-time projects or programs benefiting the unincorporated area that demonstrates strong local support and commitment and a general public benefit." One time costs over and above the \$5,600 allotment from Community Development funds and the ongoing operation and maintenance costs of the additional lighting will be borne by the Airport Neighborhood Lighting District.

The Community Development Fund was established by the Board of Supervisors at \$1.5 million as part of the Final Budget during Fiscal Year 2007-2008. To date, ten projects have been awarded funding from this source; the North Martin Luther King Jr. Drive Sidewalk Project (\$12,431), the Countywide Growth Management Strategy (\$100,000), the Keyes Sidewalk Incentive Program (\$60,000), the Marshall Avenue Lighting District (\$3,200), the Empire County Service Area 27 Formation (\$5,000), the Airport Neighborhood Cleanup Event (\$5,000), the Keyes Community Services District Street Light Program (\$42,000), the Grayson County Service Area 28 Formation (\$10,000), Crows Landing Community Services District Water Meter Project (\$3,000) and the Parklawn Neighborhood Sewer Advisory Measure (\$16,500). The current uncommitted balance in the Community Development Fund is \$1,242,869. With the approval of the use of Community Development Funds for the Airport Lighting District, the uncommitted balance is \$1,237,269, not including interest earnings.

DISCUSSION:

The Airport Neighborhood Lighting District, (hereinafter referred to as the "District"), was established by the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors on December 23, 1969. The formation was initiated through a petition submitted by the parcel owners within the boundaries of the District. The District was formed to finance the operation and maintenance of streetlights within the District.

In November 2010, a petition requesting the installation of streetlights in the alleyways of the District was submitted to Stanislaus County with the signatures of 276 residents and property owners of the District. Property owners and residents signing the petition believe that alley lighting will improve the community as a whole by aiding law enforcement efforts while deterring unwanted activities. This proposal and the initial community outreach was brought forward through the efforts of the Airport Neighborhood Collaborative -- a group of public and private stakeholders, including residents, that meet at Orville Wright Elementary monthly to work on community development issues.

To achieve adequate alley lighting levels while minimizing costs, it is estimated that a maximum of forty (40) lights would be installed upon project approval. The exact number of lights installed may actually be less than 40 depending upon field placement issues such as clearances on existing utility poles, tree cover, and nearby lighting. This project will use operating and maintenance costs for 40 additional lights as the basis for increased expenses for Fiscal Year 2011-2012 assessments.

To fund the increased level of service and associated operating and maintenance costs for 40 lights, there must also be a corresponding increase in assessment for the District's property owners. Although the current assessment is formula based, it was derived based on a level of service that focused primarily on lighting local streets. Pursuant to Proposition 218, and at the advice of County Counsel, the increase in assessment and a new formula, based on lighting both local streets and alleyways, has to be approved by the District's property owners through a ballot procedure and public hearing. If the ballot procedure to increase the assessments fails, the matter will be closed. If approved, the revised assessment will take effect in Fiscal Year 2011-2012. It is anticipated that the alley lights will be installed prior to the end of June 2011 and energized in July 2011. The said installation would be conducted by the Modesto Irrigation District.

POLICY ISSUES:

State of California Streets and Highways Code Section 19130 authorizes the Board of Supervisors to be the governing body for Lighting Districts within their county.

This action is consistent with the Board's policy of providing a Safe Community, a Healthy Community, and a Well Planned Infrastructure System.

STAFFING IMPACT:

Staffing impact will be limited to the time required to prepare Board reports and their supporting materials, conduct the ballot procedure, and coordinate the project with the Modesto Irrigation District.

AIRPORT NEIGHBORHOOD LIGHTING DISTRICT ENGINEER'S REPORT Prepared January 2011 for Proposition 218 Ballot Procedure

INTRODUCTION:

The Airport Neighborhood Lighting District, (hereinafter referred to as the "District"), was established by the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors on December 23, 1969. The formation was initiated through a petition submitted by the parcel owners within the boundaries of the District. The District was formed to finance the operation and maintenance of streetlights within the District.

In November 2010 a petition, requesting the installation of streetlights in the alleyways of the District, was submitted to Stanislaus County with the signatures of 276 residents and property owners of the District. Property owners and residents signing the petition believe that alley lighting would improve the community as a whole by aiding law enforcement efforts while deterring unwanted activities.

To achieve adequate alley lighting levels while minimizing costs it is estimated that a maximum of 40 lights would be installed upon project approval. The exact number of lights installed may actually be less than 40 depending upon field placement issues such as clearances on existing utility poles, tree cover, and nearby lighting. This project will use operating and maintenance costs for 40 additional lights as the basis for planned expenses for Fiscal Year 2011-2012 assessments.

To fund the increased level of service and associated operating and maintenance costs for 40 lights there must also be a corresponding increase in assessment for the District's property owners. Pursuant to Proposition 218, an increase in assessment has to be approved by the District's property owners through an assessment ballot procedure and public hearing. If the ballot procedure to increase assessments fails, the matter will be closed. If approved, it is anticipated that the alley lights will be installed prior to the end of June 2011 and energized at the start of Fiscal Year 2011-2012.

PART I- PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS:

A. Description of the Lighting District

After the District's formation in 1969 there have been two annexations of portions of the District's territory to the City of Modesto. The first was the South Airport Annexation of 46.9 acres in March of 1980 (Modesto City Resolution 80-191) and the second was the North Airport Annexation of 72.7 acres in July of 1980 (Modesto City Resolution 80-732).

Within the present boundaries of the District there are 514 parcels on 155 aces. When including roads and alleys, the District has a combined 194.5 acres. The legal description and boundary map of the District are shown on Exhibits "A" of this report. There are currently 71 streetlights on public streets (not alleys) within the District. The lights are owned and maintained by Modesto Irrigation District. Electric service is also provided by Modesto Irrigation District.

Description of Improvements and Services

The purpose of this Lighting District is to provide streetlights that improve the area by deterring crime, vandalism, gangs, and graffiti, while promoting traffic safety and aiding law enforcement efforts within its boundaries. The special benefit assessments to be levied for this District are intended to provide a revenue source for the ongoing maintenance, operation, and servicing of the District's improvements including, but not limited to the materials, equipment, labor, utilities, and administrative expenses. However, the assessments are not intended to fund reconstruction or major renovations of the improvements and facilities.

Current Improvements and Services:

The current improvements and services to be maintained and funded entirely through the District's assessments are generally described as:

- Operate and maintain a total of seventy one (71) streetlights.
- Periodic inspection, maintenance, and bulb, lens, sensor, and fixture replacement as needed.

Proposed Additional Improvements and Services:

This proposal is to install, operate, and maintain a maximum of 40 additional lights upon existing Modesto Irrigation District utility poles within the alleys of the Airport District. The exact number of lights installed may actually be less and depends upon field placement issues such as clearances on the existing poles, tree cover, and nearby lighting. Placement issues may also necessitate the waiver of county standards for minimum/maximum distance between lights.

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PART III- METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT

Pursuant to the California Constitution Article XIIID Section 4 (Prop 218), a parcel's assessment may not exceed the reasonable cost of the proportional special benefit conferred on that parcel. General and special benefits must be separated and the parcel may only be assessed for special benefits received.

A. Benefit Analysis: Identification/Separation of Special and General Benefits

Previous benefit analysis, conducted for a 1999 ballot procedure, determined there was no general benefit associated with the existing 71 streetlights and that each parcel within the District receives special benefit equally from the improvements and services provided. That same determination is made for the proposed alley lighting.

Stanislaus County does not provide streetlights along its alleyways and as a result there is no general lighting benefit to the public at large. The County does, however, manage Lighting Districts formed at the request of property owners or developers to provide street lighting for specific areas. The source of the Lighting District's funding is an assessment specific to the District that is approved by the District's property owners. The funds are used only by and for the District.

Alley lighting will provide a direct, distinct, and special benefit only to the parcels within the Lighting District, therefore, the burden of funding them must rest solely upon the District and as a result, no general benefit has been assigned.

B. Benefit Analysis: Assignment of Special Benefits

The proposed addition of alley lighting will be implemented, maintained, and continue, solely because the District's property owners and residents petitioned for their installation; and subsequently the District's property owners approved them through an assessment ballot procedure. Were the District to cease to exist, the improvements, services, and expenditures would cease as well. Therefore the ongoing operation, maintenance and servicing of the proposed improvements would provide direct, distinct and special benefits only to the properties within the District.

The proposed improvements and services were requested by the community and because they benefit the community as a whole, each parcel within the Lighting District benefits equally and will be assigned an equal benefit for assessment purposes.

Some of the special benefits associated with the addition of alley lighting within the Airport Neighborhood Lighting District are:


- Aid to law enforcement efforts.
- Deterrent to crime, gangs, graffiti and vandalism.
- Improved personal and property safety through increased nighttime visibility.
- Improved community sense of security and safety for pedestrians, motorists, property owners and residents.

Assessment Formula

There are no proposed changes to the District's current method of apportionment. The current methodology for apportioning assessments was approved by property owner ballot (154 for, 34 against) and adopted by the Board of Supervisors on June 22, 1999 by Resolution 1999-489.

The expense of operating and maintaining the proposed 40 additional lights will be combined with the District's expense of operating and maintaining the existing lighting and assessed using the previously approved methodology.

The previously approved formula to calculate each of the 514 benefiting parcels' annual assessment is as follows:



The data to plug into this formula can be found in Part II of this report, "Cost Estimate Fiscal Year 2011-2012" and in Part IV – C "Proposed Budget Fiscal Year 2011-2012".
