FISCAL IMPACT:

The total anticipated cost for this project is \$610,000. On February 28, 2006, the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors designated and committed in specific reserves a sum of one million dollars associated with Parks Water Systems Improvements, Facilities Maintenance and Improvements, to address known issues with the Parks and Recreation Department's water systems. The current balance in this account is \$612,887.

Approval to Reject All Bids Received for Upgrades to the Frank Raines Regional Park Water Filtration System (Potable and Non-Potable) Project

DISCUSSION:

On March 1, 2011, the Board approved the Public Works Department to solicit bids for upgrades to the Frank Raines Regional Park Water Filtration System (Potable and Non-Potable) project, which would construct water system improvements that would eliminate a boil-water order from the State due to contamination problems in Frank Raines Regional Park.

On April 6, 2011, four (4) bids were received and opened. The base bid results are as follows:

Celik Engineering	\$	765,375
MCI Engineering, Inc.	\$	932,540
Mozingo Construction	\$	942,640
Hobbs Construction, Inc.	\$1	,089,300

All bids substantially exceeded the engineer's construction estimate and there are no additional Parks and Recreation Department funds available to construct this project at the as-bid price. Staff recommends that all bids be rejected in order to redesign and rebid the project to be constructed within the allocated budget.

A reduced scope of work is being considered to meet financial constraints, while meeting the purpose and needs of the project. Public Works anticipates going back to the Board in June to adopt new plans and specifications with a reduced scope of work.

POLICY ISSUES:

The recommended actions are consistent with the Board's priorities of A Safe Community and A Healthy Community by improving the contaminated water system at Frank Raines Regional Park, and providing a healthy water supply for park users.
