Approval to Declare Vehicles and Miscellaneous Heavy Equipment as Surplus and Authorize the Sale

DISCUSSION:

Public Works has determined that the cost to repair the vehicles and equipment in the attached list exceeds the value of the equipment. The equipment has outlived its useful life and is no longer of use to any other County department. The equipment has a combined book value of \$3,571.10, and the estimated salvage value is in excess of \$1,000, thus requiring Board approval for disposal.

County Ordinance 2.24.065 allows for the sale of surplus property with a residual value greater than one thousand dollars upon approval by the Board of Supervisors.

2.24.065 Sale of personal property.

The purchasing agent is authorized to sell, trade, trade in, lease, exchange, or otherwise dispose of any personal property belonging to the county which is deemed to be surplus and not required for public use by the county and which has a value of less than one thousand dollars per individual item without prior approval by the board of supervisors. Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, such disposition of surplus property may be made without securing bids or advertising. For disposition of personal property exceeding one thousand dollars per individual item, prior approval from the board of supervisors must be obtained. All proceeds from such sales shall be paid into the county treasury for the use of the county. (Ord. CS 475 §3, 1992).

It is recommended that the Board approve this request to declare as surplus, the attached list of vehicles and miscellaneous heavy equipment, and authorize the disposal. The request is being made to salvage and dispose of all the items on the attached spreadsheet using these methods:

- Release to Auction Company; (Ernst)
- Sale on Government Website; or
- County Surplus Sale.

There will be no cost to the County to sell either by auctioneer or government website, the entire cost is borne by the buyer. The net proceeds from the sale of these vehicles will return to the Department of Public Works – Morgan Shop Division estimated at \$75,000, and be directed to account 5121-42100-46000.

A County Surplus Sale would require the selling department to encounter a small fee such as, placing an ad in the local paper or other miscellaneous fees if necessary, which will be offset by the revenue from the sale.
