Approval to Accept a Donation from an Anonymous Donor of 12 Mounted Paper Prints/Pictures of Nature to be Displayed in the Juvenile Hall Corridors

DISCUSSION:

Acceptance of the donation will support the Judges Honor Roll program in the Juvenile Hall. This incentive program was implemented in June 2010 as a partnership program between Juvenile Hall staff and the Juvenile Superior Court Judges in an effort to improve detained minors' compliance with the institutions Behavioral Modification Program. Minors qualify for this program if they are in custody for more than 30 days, receive 95% of their total Behavioral Modification Program points, and have no incidents of disciplinary action. Improved compliance with the Behavioral Modification Program helps to ensure a safe and secure juvenile facility and programs. During the past 12 months, on average, 66% of those who qualify successfully complete this program. As a reward, the minors receive a certificate of accomplishment and a treat presented by staff and the Superior Court Judges. Additionally, those minors that are court committed receive three days off their court sentence. Minors can continue to earn this award on a monthly basis while in custody. In addition to the above, staff will be creating a "Wall of Dreams" in the Juvenile Hall corridors, which will be complimented by the donated paper prints/pictures of nature. The minors will have an opportunity to have their photo taken next to a particular landscaping image with their certificate in hand. This photograph will be provided to the minor upon their release. Education, programming and activities assist in preparing the youths for successful reintegration into the community.
