

DISCUSSION:

The action proposed in this item is for the adoption of an ordinance initially presented to the Board for introduction and first reading on June 28, 2011. The text from the initial agenda item has been included in this discussion.

During the meeting, significant public input was received, both in support of and in opposition to the proposed ordinance. Additional information has been submitted by both supporters and opponents of the proposed ordinance. This information has been distributed to all members of the Board of Supervisors and is a part of the record established for this item.

As stated during the introduction of the proposed ordinance, adoption of the ordinance will in no way prohibit or otherwise discourage contractors from independently entering into Project Labor Agreements. While to the best of our knowledge the County has no recent bids that have required Project Labor Agreements, this ordinance, if adopted, would formally establish a County policy prohibiting the requirement for Project Labor Agreements on County projects, and would reinforce the County's public policy position of supporting open competition in bidding on County projects.

During comments by the Chief Executive Officer, it was reported that prevailing wages are paid on all County construction projects, and that the prevailing wage for a Stanislaus County project is set using the Bay Area wage index. The statement that prevailing wages are paid on all County construction projects is correct, and this applies to all projects whether or not a Project Labor Agreement is in place. The statement that all wages are established using the Bay Area Index is not accurate. First, as a clarification, The San Francisco Bay area is a part of the Northern California Region, a region which includes Stanislaus County. While many of the wages for trades used in County projects are established based on this region, the Department of Industrial Relations may make prevailing wage determinations on a local level, or on a statewide basis. The text of the June 28th Agenda Item is as follows:

Stanislaus County, like other governmental agencies faces budgetary constraints and the need to maximize tax payer dollars, acknowledges that competition in contracting is fundamental to securing value. Approval of staff's recommendation is intended to ensure fair and open competition in contracting and fiscal responsibility in construction projects.

A project labor agreement is a type of collective bargaining agreement entered into between labor organizations and a contractor that applies to the contractor's

construction project. For purposes of this proposed ordinance, introduced as Chapter 2.98 of the Stanislaus County Code, it shall mean any pre-hire, collective bargaining or similar type of agreement entered into with one or more labor organizations, employees or employee representatives that establishes the terms and conditions of employment on a construction project. The agreements can cover a wide variety of matters, but typically limits strikes, lockouts and other types of work stoppages in exchange for concessions from the contractor regarding wages, benefits, and other terms of employment in connection with the construction project.

The proposed ordinance prohibiting any requirement for project labor agreements only applies to County construction projects. The proposed ordinance defines construction projects as County projects for construction, rehabilitation, alteration, conversion, extension, maintenance, repair, or improvement of any structure or real property.

Specifically, the proposed ordinance prohibits the County from taking action that would require a contractor to enter into a project labor agreement as a condition of bidding, negotiating, awarding or performing a County construction project except as otherwise required by State or Federal law as a contracting or procurement obligation or as a condition of the receipt of State or Federal funds.

It is important to note that nothing in the proposed ordinance would prohibit a private party that may perform work on County construction projects from voluntarily entering into project labor agreements independent of any County requirements.

The proposed ordinance copies the prohibition adopted in San Diego County, and is similar to prohibitions in Orange County and other jurisdictions throughout California.

POLICY ISSUES:

Approval of this ordinance supports the Board of Supervisors' priorities of A Strong Local Economy and the Efficient Delivery of Public Services by ensuring fair and open competition for bidding public construction projects.

STAFFING IMPACT:

There are no staffing impacts associated with this item. Existing staff from the Chief Executive Office, County Counsel and the Clerk of the Board will work cooperatively to process this item if approved.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT THE COUNTY FROM REQUIRING PROJECT LABOR AGREEMENTS ON COUNTY CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF STANISLAUS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 2.98 is added to the Stanislaus County Code to read as follows:

"Chapter 2.98 PROJECT LABOR AGREEMENTS

"Section 2.98.010 Definitions.

"For the purposes of this Chapter, the following definitions shall apply:

"1. 'Contractor' shall mean and include a contractor, subcontractor, material supplier, carrier or other person or firm engaged in the completion of a construction project.

"2. 'Construction project' shall mean and include any project for the construction, rehabilitation, alteration, conversion, extension, maintenance, repair, or improvement of any structures or real property.

"3. 'Project labor agreement' shall mean any pre-hire, collective bargaining or similar type of agreement entered into with one or more labor organizations, employees or employee representatives that establishes the terms and conditions of employment on a construction project."

"Section 2.98.020 Prohibition on Use of Project Labor Agreements.

"A. Except as otherwise required by State or Federal law as a contracting or procurement obligation or as a condition of the receipt of State or Federal funds, the County shall not require a contractor on a construction project to execute or otherwise become a party to a project labor agreement as a condition of bidding, negotiating, award or performance of a contract.

"B. Nothing in this Chapter shall be construed as prohibiting private parties that may perform work on County construction projects from entering into project labor agreements or engaging in activity protected by law."

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days from and after the date of its passage and before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage it shall be published once, with the names of the members voting for and against the same, in the Modesto Bee, a newspaper published in the County of Stanislaus, State of California.



General prevailing wage determinations: 2011-1 journeyman determinations

**General prevailing wage determinations
made by the director of industrial relations**

**Pursuant to California Labor Code part 7,
chapter 1, article 2, sections 1770, 1773, and 1773.1**

The effective date of each determination is ten (10) days after the issue date. (8 CCR § 16000). The general determinations are issued twice a year (February 22nd and August 22nd) and go into effect ten days thereafter (March 3rd in a leap year and March 4th in a non-leap year for determinations issued on February 22nd, and September 1st for determinations issued on August 22nd).

To locate a particular journeyman craft or classification's prevailing wage determination, holiday, advisory scope of work, or travel and subsistence provision, please follow the six steps in the table below:

Step one	Statewide	First examine if your craft's determination is among the basic trades that apply to most counties in California.
Step two (A)	Northern California	If you have not found your craft in step one, check this area to see if your craft's determination is one of Northern California's basic trades.
Step two (B)	Southern California	If you have not found your craft in step one, check this area to see if your craft's determination is one of Southern California's basic trades.
Step three	San Diego	After following steps one and two (B), examine this area if your project is in San Diego County.
Step four	Choose a county County determinations (subtrades) - excel format	If you have not found your craft in steps 1, 2, or 3, choose the county where work is being performed to examine the subtrades. HTML format.
Step five	Choose a County County determinations (subtrades) Shift differential pay - excel format	Examine the county (if shown) where work is being performed to see if your classification has a shift differential pay determination. HTML format.
Step six	Important notices	Check the important notices to see if any corrections, interims, or modifications have been issued that may apply to your determination.

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ORDINANCE NO. C.S. 1103

**AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT THE COUNTY FROM REQUIRING PROJECT
LABOR AGREEMENTS ON COUNTY CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS**

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF STANISLAUS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 2.98 is added to the Stanislaus County Code to read as follows:

"Chapter 2.98 PROJECT LABOR AGREEMENTS

"Section 2.98.010 Definitions.

"For the purposes of this Chapter, the following definitions shall apply:

"1. 'Contractor' shall mean and include a contractor, subcontractor, material supplier, carrier or other person or firm engaged in the completion of a construction project.

"2. 'Construction project' shall mean and include any project for the construction, rehabilitation, alteration, conversion, extension, maintenance, repair, or improvement of any structures or real property.

"3. 'Project labor agreement' shall mean any pre-hire, collective bargaining or similar type of agreement entered into with one or more labor organizations, employees or employee representatives that establishes the terms and conditions of employment on a construction project."

"Section 2.98.020 Prohibition on Use of Project Labor Agreements.

"A. Except as otherwise required by State or Federal law as a contracting or procurement obligation or as a condition of the receipt of State or Federal funds, the County shall not require a contractor on a construction project to execute or otherwise become a party to a project labor agreement as a condition of bidding, negotiating, award or performance of a contract.

"B. Nothing in this Chapter shall be construed as prohibiting private parties that may perform work on County construction projects from entering into project labor agreements or engaging in activity protected by law."




