FISCAL IMPACT (Continued):

(CDC) base allocation is \$372,902 and covers the period of August 10, 2011 through August 9, 2012. The State General Fund Pandemic Influenza allocation is \$77,870 and covers the period from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. The Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP) allocation is \$296,420 and covers the period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012.

The CDC and HPP funding were included in the approved Fiscal Year 2011-2012 budget. The State General Fund Pandemic Influenza was not included at that time. The attached budget journal and corresponding staff recommendation would add the State General Fund Pandemic Influenza allocation of \$77,870 funding to the budget, as well as bring the CDC and HPP funding, included in the approved Fiscal Year 2011-2012 budget, in line with the actual award. There is no fiscal impact to the General Fund.

DISCUSSION:

In order to ensure greater coordination of separate funding streams and maximize integration of funds, the California Department of Public Health is again issuing a single guidance and Comprehensive Agreement for all funding sources.

These funding sources are:

• Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) all-hazards funds awarded to California by the CDC for CDPH and Local Health Departments (LHDs) to develop and maintain public health preparedness.

Approval for the Health Services Agency to Submit an Application to the California Department of Public Health for Funding Allocation of \$747,192 under the 2011-12 Centers for Disease Control Public Health Emergency Preparedness Funding, State General Fund Pandemic Influenza Funding, and U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Assistant Secretary for Prevention and Response Hospital Preparedness Program Funding Agreement Page 3

- Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP) funds awarded to California by the Assistant Secretary for Prevention and Response (ASPR) for health care facilities and emergency medical services (EMS) to develop and maintain disaster preparedness.
- Local pandemic influenza planning funds appropriated from the State General Fund for LHDs to develop and maintain preparedness for pandemic influenza.

Although a Comprehensive Agreement will be used in 2011-2012, each funding source requires a separate Work Plan and Budget, and funds from each funding source must be tracked separately. The following is a breakdown of each funding source and a summary of the corresponding required activities:
