# **DISCUSSION:**

Last year, for the first time, Stanislaus County participated in the 2010 Great California ShakeOut joining millions of people throughout California who also participated. Stanislaus County Departments practiced the *Drop, Cover, and Hold On Drill* for one minute on October 21, at 10:21 a.m. Additional information for preparing for an earthquake at home and at work was also provided to County employees through the safety officers of participating departments.

This year, the Great California ShakeOut will again be statewide and will take place on October 20, 2011 at 10:20 a.m. The ShakeOut drill is an annual drill held on the third Thursday of October every year. According to the ShakeOut website, more than 7.4 million Californians are already registered to participate this year. Stanislaus County has 23,836 people registered so far including schools, colleges, local government, businesses, preparedness organizations, individuals and families.

California is prone to earthquakes and they can happen anywhere including Stanislaus County. Support of this resolution will promote earthquake preparedness activities for Stanislaus County departments and staff. Staff has encouraged the cities and other government entities to participate in the ShakeOut via the Operational Area Council meetings.

## **POLICY ISSUES:**

Approval to Participate in the Great California ShakeOut supports the Board's priority of A Safe Community.

## STAFFING IMPACT:

Existing staff from the Office of Emergency Services will provide ShakeOut information to the County departments and general public.

# A RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE GREAT CALIFORNIA SHAKEOUT AND WORK TOWARD BECOMING A SAFER COMMUNITY

WHEREAS, the County of Stanislaus recognizes that no community is immune from natural hazards whether it be earthquake, wildfire, flood, winter storms, drought, heat wave, or dam failure and recognizes the importance enhancing its ability to withstand natural hazards as well as the importance of reducing the human suffering, property damage, interruption of public services and economic losses caused by those hazards; and

WHEREAS, major earthquakes could pose a particular, significant, and ongoing threat to the entire Stanislaus County region; and
