Subject: Water Work Group Invitation

Dear Supervisor O'Brien,

As co-conveners of the Water Work Group of the California Partnership for the San Joaquin Valley (Partnership), we invite you to appoint a member of your Board of Supervisors to the Partnership Water Work Group. In addition, you are welcome to include a technical advisor who is familiar with water management issues in your county.

The Partnership was established by Executive Order in 2005 and continues under the leadership of Governor Brown to advocate for issues that are important to the whole of the San Joaquin Valley. Reliability and quality of water supplies is one of the critical issues facing the Valley today.

Attached is a list of current members of the Water Work Group. At this time, the only two County Supervisors on the list are Partnership Board members appointed by the Governor. The Partnership wants to insure that input is received from the remaining six counties in the San Joaquin Valley as the Water Work Group pursues its agenda.

Thus far, the Water Work Group has developed and adopted a framework for an Integrated Regional Water Management Plan for the San Joaquin Valley. The framework does not represent the plan, but provides for the incorporation of principles built around the co-equal goals of protecting the Delta while insuring the reliability and quality of water supplies for the entire Valley.

As you may know, the Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) is the official environmental process to determine how the co-equal goals mentioned above will be met. One of the objectives of the Water Work Group going forward will be to seek common responses to various aspects of the draft environmental document. To the extent that the Valley can speak with one voice, our needs are more likely to be met.

Even after the BDCP is adopted, the related projects are likely to extend well beyond a decade. In the interim, we must advocate for projects that help sustain the Delta infrastructure, improve flows, and conserve and reclaim water to stabilize and make the best use of available water supplies. The Water Work Group will be analyzing and prioritizing projects that will benefit the entire Valley, and advocate for them at State and Federal levels.

Both of the aforementioned goals of the Water Work Group will require input and ultimate support from all eight counties in the Valley. We are also collaborating with the Delta Coalition of five counties, with San Joaquin County being represented in both organizations. Meetings are scheduled ad hoc as dictated by issues and work load. For these reasons we ask that you appoint a representative to the Partnership Water Work Group, and would appreciate your advising us of your decision. We're looking forward to working with you.
