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DISCUSSION:

In compliance with County and Department policy, Behavioral Health and Recovery Services is using a competitive process for contract provider programs that have been renewed annually for five or more years, to ensure the best possible services are being delivered to clients in the most cost-effective way and with the least possible disruption to their lives. The contract provider programs for which Behavioral Health and Recovery Services is seeking authorization to issue Requests for Proposals (RFP) are as follows:

- Therapeutic Behavioral Services and Outpatient Services for children, adolescents and their families in Stanislaus County, as well as, Therapeutic Behavioral Services for eligible Stanislaus County beneficiaries who reside in other counties.
- Mental health, case management, parent education and support services to high risk children from birth to five years old, and their families.

The Department will work with the General Services Agency to issue the RFPs and will return to the Board with the recommended award of agreements for these services.
