equipment. The LLEBG funds are now included in the JAG program.

The grant funding will provide \$145,713 in Federal funding to Stanislaus County. The funding will be shared between the Stanislaus County Sheriff, Probation and the City of Modesto. This represents a decrease of \$17,791 for the County and \$22,695 for the City of Modesto from the 2011 JAG award of \$186,199 awarded by BJA and approved by the Board of Supervisors on July 19, 2011. The City of Modesto received \$131,513 and \$54,686 was shared between the Probation and Sheriff's Departments. A County match is not required.

#### DISCUSSION:

Funding in the amount of \$145,713 is available in 2012 from the JAG program for use in Stanislaus County. Awards are made in the first fiscal year of the appropriation and may be expended during the following three years for a total of four years. This is the eighth year that the JAG program will be available. Funding received from the 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011 JAG have been utilized to fund positions that were previously funded through the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant.

Previously, funding received through the LLEBG was utilized to fund one full-time Deputy Probation Officer for the Domestic Violence Program and one full-time Deputy Sheriff to provide community policing services for the South Modesto area surrounding the Shackleford School area and one-half of a Deputy Sheriff position to provide a School Resource Officer on site at the Tuolumne Elementary School.

For the fourth time in the seven years the county has been receiving Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funds from the Department of Justice (DOJ), the County and the City of Modesto must file jointly due to what the DOJ terms Disparate Allocation. According to the DOJ this occurs "when a city or municipality is scheduled to receive one and one-half times (150 percent) more than a county with concurrent jurisdiction, while that county bears more than 50 percent of the costs associated with prosecution or incarceration of the municipality's Part 1 violent crime. When this occurs, the county and cities must identify a fiscal agent and submit a joint application for the total eligible amount." The Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department has been identified as the fiscal agent and will submit a joint application with the City of Modesto Police Department for the

total grant amount of \$145,713 to be split among three agencies as described in the memorandum of agreement. The DOJ allocation of funds provides the county with \$36,895 and the city \$108,818. The grant also allows for an administrative fee of up to 10% to be charged by the fiscal agent. The Sheriff's Department will be charging a 3% administrative fee. The application of the administrative fee will result in the county receiving \$40,160 and the city receiving \$105,553.

Recommended distribution of the 2012 JAG funds is as follows:

The Modesto Police Department will use its allocated share of \$105,553 to purchase, install and train for a personnel scheduling and tracking software program with remaining funding to purchase approximately nine personal video recording devices for patrol officers. The JAG funds of \$26,841 for the Sheriff and \$10,054 for Probation will assist both departments with the funding of one-fourth of the Deputy Sheriff position assigned as a School Resource Officer for Tuolumne Elementary School and one-eighth of a Deputy Probation Officer for the Domestic Violence Program.

If the Board of Supervisors concurs, an application will be finalized with the Bureau of Justice Assistance for this funding. The Sheriff's Department recommends the County take advantage of this funding opportunity and approve the staff recommendations to accept the funding from the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance.

The Sheriff recommends that the Board of Supervisors approve the attached Memorandum of Agreement between the County of Stanislaus and the City of Modesto for the Justice Assistance Grant Program Award and authorize the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors to sign the Memorandum of Agreement approving the joint application by the Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department and the City of Modesto Police Department.

#### **POLICY ISSUES:**

Board approval to apply for this entitlement funding is necessary prior to the obligations of program funds. Utilization of this funding will enhance criminal justice processes in our community, consistent with the Board's stated priorities of ensuring A Safe Community and Effective Partnerships.

#### STAFFING IMPACT:

There are no recommendations to modify the Salary and Position Allocation Resolution by this

# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF STANISLAUS AND THE CITY OF MODESTO FOR THE EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) FORMULA PROGRAM: LOCAL SOLICITATION AWARD

This Agreement is made and entered into this 19	of May, 2012, by and between
The County of Stanislaus, hereinafter referred to	as COUNTY, and the City of Modesto,
hereinafter referred to as CITY, to distribute the a	above referenced grant funds:

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the CITY, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party, and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the CITY find that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of both parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this Agreement, and

WHEREAS, the CITY's share of the JAG award that was awarded to both the COUNTY and CITY for the Technology/Equipment Offset is \$105,553 (\$108,818 less 3% Administrative Fee of \$3,265 to be paid to the County), and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the CITY believe it to be in their best interests to reallocate the JAG funds as set forth above.

NOW THEREFORE, the COUNTY and CITY agree as follows:

#### Section 1.

COUNTY agrees CITY'S share of the award is a total of \$105,553 of JAG funds.

#### Section 2.

CITY agrees to use \$105,553 to purchase personnel scheduling and tracking software program, modules, and personal video recording devices.

#### Section 3.

The CITY agrees to provide the COUNTY a quarterly financial and programmatic report not later than fifteen (15) calendar days after the end of the quarter. This will allow the COUNTY to submit the final report on the grant in the required thirty (30) calendar days after the end of each quarter.

The Programmatic and Financial Reporting Periods and Due Dates to the County are as follows:

October-December January 15
January-March April 15
April-June July 15
July-September October 15

#### Section 4.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against COUNTY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the Tort Claims Act.

#### Section 5.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against CITY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the Tort Claims Act.

#### Section 6.

Each party to this Agreement will be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this Agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by the other party.

### Section 7.

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

#### Section 8.

By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

The signature of the parties below designate acceptance of the terms of this Agreement and shall be binding upon the parties upon the effective date of the Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the City of Modesto, a municipal corporation, has authorized the execution of this Agreement in duplicate by its City Manager and attestation by its City Clerk under authority of Resolution No. 2012-<u>160</u>, adopted by the Council of the City of Modesto on the <u>1st</u>day of May, 2012, and the County of Stanislaus has caused this Agreement to be duly executed.
