DISCUSSION:

The Community Services Agency's (CSA) Plan for Fraud Investigations and Program Integrity Efforts documents the County's program for Anti-Fraud activities. The plan documents the collaborative efforts and partnerships of the CSA Special Investigations Unit, In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) Program Staff, the District Attorney's Office, the California Department of Health Care Services and the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) working together in order to preserve the integrity of the IHSS program.

On September 5, 2012, the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors received the attached letter from the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) informing counties that CDSS will permit counties to administratively claim Medi-Cal federal financial participation (FFP) for allowable county expenditures retroactive to July 1, 2012 for the Fraud Investigations and Program Integrity Efforts related to the IHSS Program. Administrative claiming refers to the invoice process CDSS requires for all California counties to receive funding for Social Services programs and that will be used by CSA to submit IHSS Fraud expenditures for 50% Federal funding reimbursement. CDSS must authorize this claiming through approval of a County submission of requested documents. CSA has selected option 2 and will submit: Enclosure A - County Response Cover Page; Enclosure B - a County Board of Supervisors approved budget for FY 2012-2013 consistent with Final Budget authority; letter of plan extension for the County Fraud Investigations and Program Integrity Efforts Related to the IHSS Program through FY 2012-2013.

As described within the Final FY 2012-2013 County Budget approved on September 11, 2012, the Board of Supervisors approved to continue the Community Services Agency IHSS Fraud program consistent with authority provided on February 28, 2012 in spite of the State Budget Trigger action which eliminated State funding for fraud detection effective January of 2012 forward. The 2012-2013 Adopted Proposed Budget relied on Federal funds of \$208.549, provided County General Fund match of \$62,839, and established Contingency match funding for IHSS Fraud in the amount of \$145,710 for a total of \$417,098. The Department updated this projection for IHSS Fraud at the Final Budget to \$409,837, a decrease of \$7,261 from the Adopted Proposed Budget estimate of \$417,098. Federal funding continues at a 50% sharing ratio with County funding required for the remaining 50% share of cost. Given the prior level of County General Funds of \$62,839 committed for IHSS Fraud, this resulted in a County match request increase of \$142,079, down from the estimate of \$145,710 in the Adopted Proposed Budget. The Board of Supervisors approved the \$142,079 increased General Fund support for IHSS Fraud by 4/5 vote in their adoption of the Final County Budget for FY 2012-2013.

Approval of the Community Services Agency County Fraud Investigations and Program Integrity Efforts Related to The In-Home Supportive Services Program Plan Extension for Fiscal Year 2012-2013
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The information package required by CDSS was not available within the Final Budget time frames and is submitted now to document the Board's approval and funding commitment to extend the IHSS Fraud program through FY 2012-2013.

Program Integrity efforts within the IHSS program are administered in a team approach that begins with the assessments provided by IHSS Social Workers. It is monitored through Quality Assurance and when there is suspected abuse a referral is made to the CSA Special Investigations Unit for Fraud Investigation. The IHSS Fraud Investigations Program has an established record of cost avoidance since its inception in January of 2010. The Department projects approximately 384 completed investigations during Fiscal Year 2012-2013 with a total cost avoidance of \$1.3 million in program savings.

The local return on investment (ROI) has declined with the loss of State General Fund support for IHSS Fraud Investigations, however it remains positive. For every \$1 the County spends on the IHSS Anti Fraud Pilot Program, \$1.12 will be saved in County costs of IHSS. The recently approved Community First Choice Option (CFCO) enhanced Federal funding for the IHSS program and will reduce the County level return on investment, remaining essentially cost neutral. The IHSS Fraud Investigations program will continue to be an important component of IHSS Program Integrity.

As the IHSS Fraud program will continue to produce positive results for the County contingent upon Federal funding, the department requests approval of the attached documents to continue to claim Medi-Cal Federal Financial participation program costs. For Counties that will continue the IHSS Fraud Program, CDSS requires: 1.) The County to send a letter requesting extension of their Fiscal Year 2011-2012 County Fraud Plan to the current fiscal year; 2.) The County Board of Supervisors must approve the attached County Fraud Funding Plan for Fiscal Year 2012-2013 and; 3.) The Board of Supervisors sign the attached County Response Cover Page.

POLICY ISSUES:

Approval of this item supports the Board's priorities of Efficient Delivery of Public Services and Effective Partnerships by working with County partners to investigate and prosecute fraud which strengthens IHSS program integrity.

STAFFING ISSUES:

The Community Services Agency will commit existing program staff resources to support the Fraud Investigations and Program Integrity efforts for the In-Home Supportive Services Program, in accordance with the Fiscal Year 2012-2013 Plan.

Honorable Chair and Board Members:

The purpose of this letter is to inform counties that the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) will permit counties to administratively claim Medi-Cal federal financial participation (FFP) for allowable county expenditures retroactive to July 1, 2012. To obtain CDSS approval counties must submit either:

- 1) A County Board of Supervisors approved Fraud Plan and budget for fiscal year (FY) 2012/13, or
- 2) A County Board of Supervisors approved budget for FY 2012/13 and a letter extending their FY 2011/12 County Fraud Plans to the current fiscal year.

The new fraud plan or budget and letter of extension must reflect coordination with the County Welfare Director and the District Attorney and approval by the County Board of Supervisors prior to submission. The letter and approved budget will satisfy the fraud plan requirements necessary to permit administrative claiming.
