Approval to Introduce and Waive the First Reading of an Ordinance to Amend Title 11, Section 11.08.020, Red Curb Marking - Streets Designated, (Shoemake Avenue), of the Stanislaus County Code

DISCUSSION:

The Hart Ransom School Board has requested that Stanislaus County install a "No Stopping at Any Time" (Red Zone) on the north side of Shoemake Avenue immediately east of its intersection with Dakota Avenue. Parents have expressed concerns to the school board for the safety of pedestrians crossing Shoemake Avenue from the north side of the roadway, specifically other parents and students. There are also potential conflicts with farm equipment operating in the orchard on the north side of Shoemake Avenue at 2172 Dakota Avenue.

The school has recently built a large, paved parking lot for the purpose of dropping off students and parking for any visitors that visit that school campus.

Public Works' Traffic Engineering staff investigated the concerns and found that existing conditions do not allow for parents to safely park or stop on the north side of Shoemake Avenue and cross the road. These conditions are made more unsafe by inclement weather conditions such as rain or fog, where the visibility of the roadway is decreased. Various vehicles were observed with car doors opening into the roadway. School buses were forced to stop in the middle of the roadway to allow parents and students to cross the street to get to the school grounds.

The proposed additional Red Zone (No Stopping Anytime) on Shoemake Avenue will reduce the potential conflicts between pedestrians and vehicles. Traffic Engineering staff discussed the proposed action with the property owner at 2172 Dakota Avenue and the owner has acknowledged there will not be any negative effects to their operations. Traffic Engineering staff recommends the use of "No Stopping Anytime" signs to prevent any stopping for drop off or other reasons on the north side of Shoemake Avenue.

POLICY ISSUES:

This action is consistent with the Board's priorities of providing A Safe Community, A Healthy Community, and A Well Planned Infrastructure System by ensuring a safe travel way for motorists and pedestrians along this portion of the County roadway. California Vehicle Code 22506 requires Board approval to change and/or add parking zones.
