STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

FISCAL IMPACT:

The proposed fee adjustment would consist of new fees for the Cottage Food Operations and Body Art Programs, the removal of the Recreational Health Program's State-mandated surcharge fee, a reduction in the Hazardous Materials State-mandated surcharge fee, an increase in the ash tipping fees, as well as the inclusion of the Milk and Dairy State-mandated surcharge fee. Approval to Set a Public Hearing on April 23, 2013, at 9:05 a.m. to Introduce and Waive the First Reading of an Ordinance to Establish New and Amend Existing Fees for the Department of Environmental Resources

FISCAL IMPACT (Continued):

The ash tipping fee will increase from \$26.00 per ton, to \$26.23 per ton, for an estimated annual increase of \$18,400 to the Fink Road Landfill Operating Fund. The annual operating cost to administer the Safe Body Art Act Program will be approximately \$35,000, and the Cottage Food Operations Program could be as much as \$29,000 depending on the number of new permittees. The Recreational Health Program surcharge fee of \$6 per pool will be eliminated, \$1 of which was an administrative fee retained by the Department each year. This will result in a net loss of \$400 to the Department in Fiscal Year 2013-2014. The Department will collect the new State surcharge of \$35, reduced from \$49, from regulated businesses in the Unified Hazardous Waste and Management Regulatory Program. The total fee revenue estimated to be collected each year is \$80,500 from approximately 2,300 facilities which will be transferred annually to the California Environmental Protection Agency. The Department is also collecting the new 15% State milk and dairy farm inspection fee surcharge which the Board of Supervisors approved on September 11, 2012, and will now be included into the Department's fee structure. An estimated \$57,600 will be collected annually on behalf of the State from approximately 233 regulated businesses in the Milk and Dairy Program.

DISCUSSION:

The Department of Environmental Resources (Department) charges fees for services it provides in the program areas of Code Enforcement, Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials, Landfill, Milk and Dairy, and Solid Waste. State law mandates that fees charged for services cannot exceed actual costs and must be used to cover the costs of implementing the programs.

Annually, in preparation for the Proposed Budget, the Department evaluates the program costs and the fees associated with programs administered. This process includes the consideration of new or additional fees, where appropriate, as well as modifications to existing fees in order to cover the program costs. This year the Department is proposing the creation of new fees for the Cottage Food Operations and Body Art Programs as mandated by State law as well as the removal of the Recreational Health Program's State-mandated surcharge fee. Modifications to existing fees include a reduction in the Hazardous Material Program's State-mandated surcharge for the Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) General Oversight Program and an increase in the ash tipping fees from the Waste-to-Energy facility. Lastly, the Department is also incorporating the State's new 15% milk and dairy farm inspection fee surcharge. There are no proposed fee changes for Code Enforcement or Solid Waste.

Cottage Food Operation

In September 2012, Assembly Bill (AB) 1616, (Cottage Food Operations, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 11.5 of the California Health and Safety Code) was signed into law by Governor Jerry Brown and became effective on January 1, 2013. The law sets minimum sanitation, registration, and permitting standards for cottage food operations, also referred to as the Homemade Food Act. The bill also places limitations on cottage food operation's gross annual sales amounts.

Under Cottage Food Operations law, residents can produce limited non-potentially hazardous foods (e.g., baked goods, jams, and fruit tamales) in their home kitchens and sell them. Previously, food stored or prepared in a private home was prohibited from being used or offered for sale in a food facility.

Two class systems for these small business entrepreneurs were created including Class A, for direct food sales, and Class B, for direct and indirect food sales which enable cottage food products to be sold to a restaurant or a retail market, who in turn may sell these homemade products to consumers. The new law imposes labeling requirements to advise consumers that the food was made in a home kitchen. Products sold through indirect sales may also be used as ingredients for food items prepared in restaurants or other retail food facilities.

The Department is now proposing to establish new fees to cover the Cottage Food Operation Program costs for the cost of permit issuance and registration, annual inspections and re-inspections, complaint responses, and outreach and education. The proposed fees are calculated using the Department's weighted labor rate (WLR) and a recently conducted fee survey of comparable counties indicates the proposed fees are comparable. The projected annual operating cost could be as much as \$29,000 depending on the number of new permittees. The proposed fee schedule is included as Attachment A.

On March 5, 2013, the Department held a public meeting (Attachment B) to discuss the proposed Cottage Food Operations fees. Information about the workshop was disseminated through the Department's normal dissemination process via email and postal service mailed to all parties affected or potentially affected by the fees. In addition, information regarding the proposed fees is posted on the Department's web site. Overall, the feedback from the workshop participants was in favor of the proposed fees.

Safe Body Art Act

On October 9, 2011, Governor Jerry Brown signed into law AB 300; the Safe Body Art Act (Act), which has been codified in the Health and Safety Code commencing with Section 119300 and became effective July 1, 2012. The Act established sterilization, sanitation, and safety standards for persons engaged in the business of tattooing, body piercing, or applying permanent cosmetics in the State of California. The Act authorizes local enforcement agencies to: require facility permits and practitioner registration; require mechanical clasp and stud ear piercing facility notification; inspect body art facilities; regulate the performance of body art in vehicles, temporary booths, and at body art events; and take enforcement action for non-compliance. On June 19, 2012, the Board of Supervisors authorized the Department to implement the Safe Body Art Act and at that time the Department indicated that a proposed fee structure would be brought back for consideration of adoption in the Spring of 2013.

In an effort to educate facilities about the Safe Body Art Act, a Safe Body Art Advisory Committee was created. The committee was comprised of local body art facility owners and practitioners and as well as members of the Department Safe Body Arts Team. Committee members provided valuable input into the development of this new program. In addition, a web page has been created to help facilities and practitioners comply with the Act, and

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currently include links to: the Safe Body Art Act, approved on-line bloodborne pathogen classes, California Department of Public Health authorized sharps mail-back services, and all forms needed to successfully complete the permitting process.

The Department is now proposing to establish new fees for the Safe Body Art Act Program to cover the cost of permit issuance and registration, annual inspections and re-inspections, complaint responses, and outreach and education. The proposed fees are calculated using the Department's WLR and a recently conducted fee survey of comparable counties indicates the proposed fees are comparable. The projected annual operating cost is estimated to be \$35,000 and the proposed fee schedule is included as Attachment A.

On March 5, 2013, the Department held a public meeting (Attachment B) to discuss the proposed Safe Body Art Act fees. Information about the workshop was disseminated through the Department's normal dissemination process via email and postal service mailed to all parties affected or potentially affected by the fees. In addition, information regarding the proposed fees is posted on the Department's web site. Overall, the feedback from the workshop participants was in favor of the proposed fees. The Department received one comment pertaining to the proposed fee for Temporary Event Artist Registration. The comment was taken into consideration and the proposed fee was modified from one hour of staff time to one-half hour which is more in line with what would be necessary at a temporary event.

Recreational Health

Beginning January 1, 2010, AB 1020 required the owners of public swimming pools to be in compliance with amendments to the California Health and Safety Code, Sections 116064.1 and 116064.2. Section 116064.1 is an administrative section addressing the uniform statewide health and safety standards for public swimming pools to prevent physical entrapment and serious injury to children and adults, similar to the Federal Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act. Section 116064.2 described the requirements for the installation of devices and systems to prevent entrapment of swimmers.

Subsection (1) of 116064 authorized the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) to assess an annual surcharge on the owner of each public swimming pool and established a State Recreational Health Fund. Local jurisdictions were authorized to add up to a \$6 surcharge to the normal annual fee for public swimming pools. Local jurisdictions could retain a portion of the fee collected in an amount necessary to cover the administrative costs of collecting the fee and any necessary reporting, but in no case was the fee to exceed \$1. Money in the fund was available to CDPH, upon appropriation by the legislature, for the purpose of carrying out its responsibilities under the statute. The collection of this fee for CDPH was to sunset on January 1, 2014.

AB 1467 became effective on June 27, 2012. The key elements contained in the law relating to the federal Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act remain in effect. This bill, however, eliminated the Recreation Health Fund and the CDPH's authority to administer or enforce specific public swimming pool provisions related to anti-entrapment devices. Local

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Health Officers and Directors of Environmental Health continue to have authority to enforce the anti-entrapment law.

As of June 27, 2012, the effective date of AB 1467, counties are no longer authorized to collect the annual surcharge from public pool owners. Monies collected prior to June 27, 2012, were sent to the State as provided in Section 116064.2. At this time, the Department is requesting to eliminate the \$6 surcharge fee from the existing fee schedule.

Hazardous Materials State Surcharge for the Certified Unified Program Agency General Oversight

On February 26, 2013, the Board of Supervisors authorized the Department to collect a modified surcharge fee on behalf of the State of California for the CUPA General Oversight Program. The Department is now collecting this surcharge of \$35, reduced from \$49, as required in Section 25404 of the California Health and Safety Code, which will now also be incorporated into the new Department fee structure.

Ash Tipping Fee

On June 26, 2012, the Board of Supervisors approved the Amended and Restated Service Agreement with Covanta Stanislaus, Inc., for the operation of the waste-to-energy facility. As result, ash tipping fees were raised in Fiscal Year 2012-2013 by \$10 per ton. This increase was necessary in order to cover future ash monocell development/construction costs as well as the post-closure obligations at the Geer Road Landfill. Also included in the new Service Agreement was a clause that would escalate the tipping fee each July 1st based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI), "Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers, All items, West-Size B/C." The CPI will increase the ash tipping fee by 0.9% for Fiscal Year 2013-2014. This will increase the current \$26 per ton tipping fee for ash to \$26.23 per ton.

Milk and Dairy State Surcharge

On September 11, 2012, the Board of Supervisors authorized the Department to collect the new State-mandated milk and dairy farm inspection fee surcharge, on behalf of the State of California, effective October 1, 2012, as required by Section 33253 of the California Food and Agricultural Code. The revenue is transferred to the California Department of Food and Agriculture on a quarterly basis. This 15 % State surcharge will now be incorporated into the Department's fee structure.

Public Hearing

Prior to levying a new fee or amending an existing fee, the County is required by Government Code Section 54985 et seq., to hold a scheduled public hearing as part of a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors. Department staff recommends that the Board schedule a public hearing for April 23, 2013, at 9:05 a.m., to introduce and waive the first readings of modified Ordinance to establish new and amend the existing fees of the Department of Environmental Resources. If approved, these fee changes for Environmental

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Resources will correspond with Fiscal Year 2013-2014, and will become effective on June 7, 2013, with the exception of the ash tipping fee which will become effective on July 1, 2013. The fee changes are summarized in the table, below.


