Approval to Adopt the Mitigated Negative Declaration Pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15074(B) for the State Route 99/Hammett Road Interchange Project

### **DISCUSSION:**

Stanislaus County, in cooperation with Caltrans District 10, proposes to reconstruct the Highway 99 at Hammett Road interchange in the community of Salida. The County anticipates increased growth in the Salida area, which will yield higher traffic volumes on the existing facilities. The additional growth and increased traffic volumes are anticipated with future improvements to the economy. Three build alternatives and a no-build alternative were proposed and studied for this interchange. Alternative #3 was the preferred alternative and has been estimated to cost approximately \$40.5 million (in today's dollars) for construction and right of way. The project will not move into the PS&E phase until growth drives the need for the interchange improvements. It was important to complete the environmental phase of the project so that when development in this area does increase, there is an entitlement document in place to reserve the proper right of way for the interchange improvements.

The proposed interchange improvements include reconstruction of the existing interchange to provide improved operations for turning movements to and from State Route (SR) 99, as well as associated local road improvements at adjacent intersections.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) clearance was obtained on January 7, 2013 by Caltrans. An Initial Study with Mitigated Negative Declaration/Environmental Assessment with Finding of No Significant Impact was prepared, circulated, approved, and adopted by Caltrans (California Department of Transportation).

During the review and comment period, the County acting as the responsible agency, commented on the proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) and participated in the CEQA process as required by Title 14 California Code of Regulations, Section 15096. Caltrans, the Lead Agency, adopted the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration (FMND) and a mitigation monitoring and reporting program on January 7, 2013. The County hereby incorporates by reference as though fully set forth herein Lead Agency's Resolution, including the CEQA findings and mitigation monitoring and reporting program adopted on that date as part of the record of this approval. The County has not identified any feasible alternative or additional feasible mitigation measures within its powers that would substantially lesson or avoid any significant effect the project would have on the environment under CEQA Guidelines 15041(b), 15096(g). There is no evidence or circumstances which exist that would require the preparation of additional environmental documents pursuant to CEQA Guidelines 15162. No substantial changes to the Project have been proposed which would require major revisions of the FMND due to the new significant environmental effects. Present circumstances are materially the same as at the time the Lead Agency's adoption of the FMND. No new information of substantial importance, which was not known and could not have been known with the exercise of reasonable diligence at the time the FMND was adopted by the Lead Agency, shows that the County's actions will have one or more significant effects not discussed in the FMND or that additional mitigation measures are required. The Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Plan adopted by the Lead Agency is fully enforceable.

Approval to Adopt the Mitigated Negative Declaration Pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15074(B) for the State Route 99/Hammett Road Interchange Project

Upon the Board's finding that the project will not have a significant effect on the environment, Public Works will file a Notice of Determination in accordance with Section 21152(a) of the California Public Resources Code.

### **POLICY ISSUES:**

The recommended actions are consistent with the Board's priorities of providing A Safe Community, A Healthy Community and A Well Planned Infrastructure System by adopting the environmental document for the interchange located at Hammett Road, which in the future will be functionally operational and safe for the traveling public.

There is no staffing impact associated with this item.





## **Mitigated Negative Declaration**

## **Project Description**

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes to reconstruct the existing State Route 99/Hammett Road interchange including the overcrossing, on and off-ramps, and certain roadway segments within the interchange limits.

#### Determination

The Department has prepared an Initial Study for this project, and following public review, has determined from this study that the proposed project would not have a significant effect on the environment for the following reasons:

The proposed project would have no effect on Land Use, Growth, Farmlands/Timberlands, Relocations, Community Impacts, Environmental Justice, Coastal Zone, Cultural Resources, Hydrology and Floodplain, Wild and Scenic Rivers, Natural Communities, Wetlands and Other Waters and Plant Species.

In addition, the proposed project would have no significant effect on Parks and Recreational Services, Utilities/Emergency Services, Traffic and Transportation/Pedestrian and Bicycle Facilities, Visual/Aesthetics, Water Quality, Paleontology, and Storm Water Runoff, Geology/Soils/Seismic/Topography, Hazardous Waste/Materials, Air Quality, and Noise and Vibration with the implementation of avoidance, minimization, and/or mitigation measures.

In addition, the proposed project would have no significantly adverse effect on biological resources (animal species, threatened and endangered species and invasive species) with the implementation of avoidance, minimization, and/or mitigation measures as recommended by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (e.g., preconstruction surveys, nesting setback, purchase of mitigation credits).
