Approval to Pay Invoices for California State Association of Counties (CSAC) Annual Conference Institute Classes taken on November 28 & November 29, 2011 Page 2

DISCUSSION:

CSAC's 117th annual conference took place during Tuesday, November 29 – Thursday, December 1, 2011. The Chief Executive Office staff registered and paid for the annual dues to attend the conference. CSAC Institute for Excellence in County Government provides break-out classes for attendee participation. The staff member signed up as a "walk-in" to attend two classes; Leadership in Decision Making and Pensions and Pension Reform. CSAC Institute did not invoice the county until March 22, 2013 for the fees to participate in the classes.

POLICY ISSUE:

Section 911.2 of the Government Code states: "A claim relating to any other cause of action shall be presented as provided in Article 2 (commencing with Section 915) not later than one year after the accrual of the cause of action." Since the two invoices are more than one year old, it requires approval by the Board of Supervisors to pay. This effort will also support the board's priority of promoting Efficient Delivery of Public Services.
