SUBJECT:

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

Conduct a public hearing to introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance to establish new and amend existing fees for the Department of Parks and Recreation.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Department of Parks and Recreation receives its revenue from entrance, use, and privilege/service fees along with various grants. The proposed fee schedule will allow the recovery of operations and maintenance costs of the regional park facilities. If the fee adjustments are approved, the anticipated revenue is minimal.



Public Hearing to Introduce and Waive the First Reading of an Ordinance to Establish New and Amend Existing Fees for the Department of Parks and Recreation

DISCUSSION:

Stanislaus County Department of Parks and Recreation (Department) operates four regional parks which charge entrance, use, and privilege/service fees: Frank Raines Off-Highway Vehicle Park, La Grange Off-Highway Vehicle Park, Modesto Reservoir, and Woodward Reservoir. The revenue collected from these fees, along with various grant funding, pays for the operations and maintenance of these facilities. In addition, the Frank Raines and La Grange Off-Highway Vehicle Parks receive State grants for operations and maintenance as well as special projects.

Annually, in preparation for the Proposed Budget, the Department evaluates the cost of services provided and the fees associated with these regional parks. The evaluation process includes the consideration of new or additional fees, where appropriate, as well as modifications to existing fees in order to cover the cost of operations and maintenance at these sites. The evaluation prepared for the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Proposed Budget, indicates there is a need to increase revenue to cover the rising costs; however, the Department recently conducted a fee survey of similar facilities in surrounding areas and found the entrance fees are comparable to other parks; therefore, the department is not recommending increases to standard entrance fees.

The Department is recommending several changes to the fee schedule language for the purpose of clarifying areas which have caused customer confusion or misunderstanding. For example, in 2012, the Department combined the fee categories for Disabled Persons, Prisoners of War, and Senior citizens into one because they were similar and charged the same fee. However, due to concerns which have been raised, separate Veterans fee categories have been included this year along with the acceptable forms of identification which must be presented. In addition, clarifying language has been added to the Designated Group Campsite Fee and the Mooring Fee. The Designated Group Campsite Fee language notes that additional camping vehicle fees also apply. The Mooring Fee language indicates that a free annual pass is included with payment of three months mooring. Lastly, the holidays where a premium fee is charged are now specifically identified as Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day. These clarifications result in no changes to the fees or revenue.

The Department is also recommending the establishment of new fees/discounts and a special event fee that could provide the opportunity to increase revenue (Attachment A), as follows:

Free entrance on Veteran's Day: In an effort to honor veterans, all Veterans would receive free day use or camping on Veteran's Day, and also on May 1st each year in honor of Memorial Day.

Veteran Camping: Veterans would pay \$5 per night (a 75% discount as compared to the standard 50% discount, or \$10 per vehicle) to camp November 1 through November 14 as an additional recognition of Veteran's Day.

Go-Kart Area Use: Historically, day use fees at the go-kart area at Woodward Reservoir have not been charged. Due to the cost to maintain this area, standard day use fees of \$10 per vehicle will be collected and signage will be posted accordingly.

Pool Rental and Deposit: Rental of the Regional Water Safety Training Center will be a rate of \$60 per hour unheated (two hours minimum), an additional \$60 per day for the number of days needed to bring the pool to a heated temperature, if the request is to have the pool heated, and a refundable deposit of \$250, not including any cost to provide a lifeguard(s). The unheated pool fee was determined by benchmarking with the pool facility fees charged by the City of Modesto for similar usage of their pools. The Department is currently looking at all possible options to realize revenue in order to continue to maintain the pool.

Event Entrance Fee at Off Highway Vehicle Parks: A new event entrance fee of \$5 would be assessed at Frank Raines and La Grange Off Highway Vehicle Parks for special events only.

On March 6, 2013, the Department held a workshop (Attachment B) to discuss the proposed fee changes with the public. Seven people attended the public meeting and a suggestion was received to charge an additional fee for usage of a heated pool. Other comments received were that attendees were present to ensure fishing and duck hunting fees were not raised, and a request was made to make storage available for duck blinds. The Department commits to reviewing the request for duck blind storage, potential areas for unsecured blind storage at both Modesto Reservoir and Woodward Reservoir, and, if storage is feasible, comparisons to determine potential fees to bring back to the Board in 2014. On March 26, 2013, a comment was received during public comment at the Board meeting, requesting to review if Exclusive Use fees could be used to allow mobile concessions. The Department is in the process of reviewing that request, and will include a recommendation in the Board presentation.

Information about the workshop was disseminated through the Department's normal dissemination process via e-mail to parties affected by the fees including waterfowl hunters, off-highway vehicle enthusiasts, regular users of the Exclusive Use process, the Stanislaus County Fish and Wildlife Committee and the Stanislaus County Parks and Recreation Commission. In addition, information regarding the proposed fees is posted on the Department's Internet site and at the Regional Parks Entrance Stations and attempts were made to distribute workshop notices to go-kart track users at the Woodward Reservoir.

On March 14, 2013, Stanislaus County Parks and Recreation Commission considered the proposed fees and supported the Department's recommendations.

The Department anticipates the opportunity to increase revenue by attracting additional special events to be held at County parks facilities. These special event proposals, which will be brought to the Board for approval, could result in \$100,000 of additional revenue in the coming year.

Proposition 26

Proposition 26 was approved by California voters on the November 2010 ballot. Its passage amended sections of the California Constitution to define many fees as taxes, stipulating that they can no longer be levied or increased unless passed by not less than a two-thirds majority vote. The Proposition, however, exempts specific types of fees from this requirement as

follows: 1) charges imposed for entrance to or use of local government property; and 2) charges for a specific benefit, privilege, or governmental service granted directly to the payor.

County Counsel has opined that Environmental Resources and Parks and Recreation fees are exempt from Proposition 26, but did clarify that benefit, privilege, and service fees such as hunting permits and reservation fees cannot be discounted. In these fee categories, all customers must be charged equally and the amounts charged cannot exceed the reasonable cost to provide the benefit/privilege/service. The Department is not proposing to discount any benefit/privilege/service fees and the fees within these categories reflect only the cost of providing these services.

Public Hearing

Prior to levying a new fee or modifying an existing fee, the County is required by County Ordinance CS-880 (Parks and Recreation) to hold a public hearing as part of a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors. At that time, the Board may introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance to establish new and amend the existing fees of the Department of Parks and Recreation. If approved, these fee changes will become effective on June 7, 2013.

POLICY ISSUE:

An ordinance of the Board of Supervisors is required to increase or establish fees for the Department of Parks and Recreation. This action is consistent with the Board's priorities of A Safe Community, A Healthy Community, A Well Planned Infrastructure System, and the Efficient Delivery of Public Services by making funds available to the Department of Parks and Recreation to continue to operate efficiently and effectively, and to assist in promoting a safe and healthy environment and improving the quality of life in Stanislaus County.



New and Amended Fees

Proposed New and Amended Existing Fees

- Four Regional Parks: Frank Raines, LaGrange, Modesto and Woodward Reservoirs
- Annually, revenue is approximately \$2.3 Million, which pays for operations and maintenance

Proposed New and Amended Existing Fees, Cont'd.

- Frank Raines and LaGrange also receive State Off-Highway Vehicle grants which offset operations and maintenance costs and pay for special projects
- In preparation for Proposed budget, the Dept. evaluates the cost of services provided and the associated fees

Proposed New and Amended Existing Fees, Cont'd.

- The evaluation for the 2013-2014 Fiscal Year indicates a need to continue to increase revenue, in order to maintain a balanced budget, as costs continue to rise
- A fee survey of similar facilities finds that entrance fees are comparable to other parks; therefore, the Dept. is not recommending increases to standard entrance fees

Proposed New and Amended Existing Fees, Cont'd.

- Fees were last raised in 2012. Other fee changes were new categories and merging of categories for consistency/consolidation

Clarifications

- In 2012, categories for Disabled Persons and 100% Permanently Disabled Veterans, Prisoners of War, and Seniors were combined into one because they were similar and charged the same fee; however, due to concerns raised, separate Veterans fee categories are included in this year's fee proposal
- Clarifying language has been added to the Designated Group Campsite Fee and Mooring Fee

Clarifications, Cont'd.

- Holidays where a premium fee is charged are now specifically identified as Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day
- These clarifications result in no changes to existing fees

New/Discount Fees

- Free entrance on Veteran's Day and May 1st each year for all Veterans, former and active duty
- Discounted Veteran and active duty Camping - \$5/night to camp Nov 1 through Nov 14

New Fees

- Go-Kart Area Use – Historically day use fees have not been charged for use of the go-kart area at Woodward Reservoir. Standard day use fees of \$10 per vehicle are proposed to be collected
- Pool Rental – Rental of the Regional Water Safety Training Center at a rate of \$60 per hour unheated (2 hours minimum), an additional \$60 per day for the number of days needed to bring the pool to a heated temperature, if requested

New Fees, Cont'd.

- Pool Rental Deposit - \$250 Refundable Pool Rental Deposit
- Event Entrance Fee at Off Highway Vehicle Parks – An additional \$5 entrance fee would be assessed at Frank Raines and La Grange Off Highway Vehicle Parks for special events only when gate fees for the event are collected

Special Events

- The Department anticipates the opportunity to increase revenue by attracting special events such as the Symbiosis event that was brought before the Board recently, on April 16th

Proposed New and Amended Existing Fees, Cont'd.

- Stakeholder meeting was conducted on March 6, 2013
- One new fee was proposed, related to renting the pool heated, based on a comment received
- Other comments received were from attendees present to ensure fishing and duck hunting fees were not raised

Proposed New and Amended Existing Fees, Cont'd.

- Additional request was for duck blind storage at the Reservoirs, which the Dept. commits to reviewing
- A comment was received during public comment at the Board meeting on March 26, 2013, requesting whether Exclusive Use category could be used to allow mobile food concessions

Proposed New and Amended Existing Fees, Cont'd.

- The Department will implement a pilot program immediately following today's hearing (May 2013) to license concession vendors to operate at Woodward Reservoir and potentially expanding to the other Regional Parks
- Vendors would include 2 mobile food vehicles and 2 ice cream/sno-cone vendors

Proposed New and Amended Existing Fees, Cont'd.

- Guidelines for this pilot program include notifying potential vendors of the opportunity via postal mail
- Vendors would be selected based on complete application, required permits, insurance coverage, and payment of fees

Proposed New and Amended Existing Fees, Cont'd.

- Guidelines include the ability to limit the days, weekends, and holidays per vendor in order to allow for multiple vendors to have the opportunity
- Two defined sites at Woodward Reservoir have been noted for location of mobile vendors: old concession area and Mountain View Point

Dear Chairman Chiesa:

The Stanislaus County Veterans Advisory Commission strongly supports the Department of Parks and Recreation's proposed Ordinance to Establish New and Amend Existing Fees on the Board of Supervisors' April 23, 2013 agenda. The Commission urges the Board to approve this item; specifically the creation of a separate fee category and the establishment of new fees / discounts for veterans.

Last year, local veterans approached the Commission with the concern that the free entry provision to County parks for fully disabled veterans and former prisoners of war had been eliminated. The Commission strongly believes that this small subset of the overall veterans' community has more than earned the privilege of free access to County parks.

Subsequent to this issue being raised, Veterans Advisory Commissioners met with representatives from the Department of Parks and Recreation in order to develop an understanding of our constituents concerns and to work toward a solution to accommodate all stake holders.

The Commission believes the solution proposed in the March 23, 2013 agenda item is the best option for the upcoming fiscal year, as it makes the following substantive changes in policy:

- De-links the senior citizen and the veteran discounts, providing each group with its own type of discount.
- Allows for two free periods available for all veterans each year; Veteran's Day and Memorial Day.
- Expands the use fee discount to all veterans at a 50% rate, with a 75% discount November 1st through the 14th each year.

These changes would begin to bring Stanislaus County policy in line with the State Park system
